PASTOR'S REPORT

Wow, this has been a year! Though it has been wonderful seeing people in person again, coming back together has been much more challenging than going virtual ever was. We could only get so many things back in place or reenvisioned at a time, and I know it took everyone a whole lot of patience (my least favorite virtue) to get us back to a place where Mt Zion felt like home. Thank you for your patience!

This past year has also been a year of a lot of transition. We said goodbye to some beloved musicians and hello to Danielle Lawson and soon will be saying hello to Mark Schroeter as well. We said goodbye to our janitor, David Ulrichsen, as he found a fulltime job (praise the Lord!) and hello to Jasmine Pruitt. My joy right now is that we are back to a full staff. Let me tell you how exhausting these transitions have been! And praise the Lord – the new additions to our team are wonderful people.

Yet, even though we have faced all these challenges, we have also done a lot. Our Sunday school began practicing service every month. Our outreach through Mission of the Month and the Lenten Giving Cross set record levels of giving this year. In worship, our AV has been upgraded with a second camera and presentation software built specifically for churches (this software has cut our administrator's time working on worship slides in half!). Right now, we are doing a trial run of a prayground, and it has been a huge success. Soon we'll be putting in new flooring in the Gathering Space to replace carpet that has seen 17 years of heavy wear-and-tear. And we are continuing work on enlarging the youth room by connected two adjoin rooms together. Now, I won't say everything from this past year has gone smoothly – when facing this many challenges, it was reality that we won't get everything right, and some things had to be put on hold – but I feel blessed to be where we are at this point and will be working hard this next year to address the places we may have fallen short.

Speaking of this next year, I know Stewardship will announce more details during our Fall Appeal, but a little preview of what's coming. This past year Leadership Board and Staff have been spending time every month learning about evangelism. Our new vision is that everyone we meet will come to know themselves as a reflection of God's image, worthy of life and love. But how is that to happen if we aren't meeting anyone? We recognize that Mt Zion needs to become more connected to and invested in our community, and the 2023 Ministry Initiatives are going to primarily focus on us meeting people and showing them God's love. As I asked in a recent children's sermon, "What do you think would happen if everyone in the world knew God's love?" One child said, "Everyone would share." What a wonderful vision! Another child said, "Be realistic. That's never going to happen." And the truth is, that child is right. At least, it'll never happen if Christians aren't sharing God's love. In 2023, Mt Zion is going to focus on sharing God's love, meeting new friends both within the church and out in the world.

 - Work in progress. Work unable to begin while the pandemic was in full swing.

- Support our new music director and the resources they needs to lead our worship
 - New musicians hired!
 - Memorial donation will be getting the bells refurbished
- Update our nursery so that families with little children feel welcome at Mt Zion
 - New pack-and-plays replaced unsafe crib
 - o Nursery cleaned out and reorganized
 - o Memorial donation supported the creation of a prayground in the sanctuary
- Provide music leadership for the Sunday school children
 - Erik Peterson stepped up as music leader
 - Our musician Danielle is researching new children's music books to purchase before the fall
- Remind the congregation about our free devotionals and the ongoing Prayer List
 - Per feedback, changed which devotions we are purchasing and which ones we are not

Study the Bible

- Provide furniture and shelves for new library, making it user friendly and inviting for all ages
 - No progress at this time.
- Invest in Adult Forum resources and opportunities for lively discussions & spiritual growth
 - No progress at this time.
- Fully remodel the MZ Youth rooms to meet the faith and community needs of our teens
 - Remodel work in progress.
 - Researching the cost to install a kitchenette in room 208, both to be used by the teens for meals during
 youth activities and cleaning dishes, as well as by the Sunday school for cooking classes and cleaning
 science and art messes.

- Improve Outreach Team's communication of Mission of the Months, increasing excitement for our partner ministries
 - Through good communication, we far exceeded our fundraising goals for multiple Mission of the Month campaigns!
- Rejuvenate our volunteer community, including for front desk, faith formation, and worship

 - Work in progress.
- Hire people to staff our nursery
