Pastor's Page

Then Jesus said to those who questioned him, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." – Matthew 22:21

As we approach the celebration of July 4, Independence Day, I believe it is important for us to consider these words of Jesus. What does it mean for us as modern-day Americans to give to God the things that are God's, and to our country the things we should begiving to it?

First, let's define two terms that often get used when we're talking about intersection of citizenship and faith:

Patriotism - the love of country

Christian Nationalism – the belief that the American nation is defined by Christianity, and that the government should take active steps to keep it that way.¹

Back in January, I learned of the existence of something called the "We the People" Bible, which is a KJV Bible with documents such as the US constitution and the bill of rights included in it. It is being marketed as patriotic. Let me be perfectly clear: I believe such a book is neither patriotic nor Christian. In fact, I think it is a rather dangerous form of Christian Nationalism.

Our faith teaches that Christ is Lord of all, regardless of how we humans draw the lines on our maps. The US government is based on the rule of law, one of which is the separation of church and state, which means the state can't force citizens to hold a particular faith. I am glad to live in a time and place where I am free to believe that Christ is my Lord. I believe it is equally important that my fellow Americans be free to believe other things and practice other faiths. Our diversity is one of our greatest strengths.

This misguided attempt to conflate Christian scripture with our governing documents is dangerous because it tries to combine good citizenship with faithfulness to God. Both are good things, but they aren't the same thing. The Bible has been around for centuries longer than our country. It's message of love and grace isn't limited just to Americans. And our country isn't made up only of people who read and love the Bible. You can be a patriot without it.

I deeply value both my Christian faith and the country whose laws give me the freedom to practice it without fear of government persecution, but the combination of these civil texts with scripture is the antithesis of both. If we are to give to God what is God's, we cannot combine the Bible with our country's governing documents

I'm proud to be an American and a Christian, but you don't have to be one to be the other and that's part of what I love about them both.

Camp VBS is quickly approaching! We are still in need of a few volunteers.


Mostly, though, we need your prayers!

Social Concerns

Social Concerns Spotlight on . . . PoP Food Distribution and Free Store -

Beginning in 2019 as a grant partnership with Sherman Lake, our Food Distribution has been a blessing to many, including our own church members. We began distributing every Thursday for the first year and as the pandemic hit, the supply chain slowed down food accessibility. We now have two distributions per month, which PoP totally funds. An average of 125 boxes of fresh healthy foods are handed out at each distribution along with other supplements such as baked goods, gallons of milk, and in season, fresh produce, (green beans, corn, watermelon, squash, onions etc.)
Boxes always include nutritious offerings (although not always the same), eggs, nuts, cereals, oranges, granola, potatoes, carrots, cheese, apples, etc.

One year ago, our Church Council came up with the idea of a Free Store to supplement the Food Distribution. They noticed folks were needing laundry detergent, cleaners, toilet paper, diapers, items that could not be purchased with food stamps or other programs. PoP totally funds this program as well, and once a month the FS is open for our guests to select 2 free store items. Working at the Food Distribution is a passion for Lynne, Cindy, Noel, Mike, Tamara, Pastor Rachel, Pam, Howard, and many more who have even brought their children to help out, like the Demings have.

Here is what one of our helpers has said about the program.

Lynne Wathan writes: I think food distribution is an incredible way to connect with our community. We know many of the folks who come each time and they know and joke with us. We have an autistic artist who comes with his mother and brings art for Pam Timm. Two islamic women always know what Christian holiday is coming and greet us with Merry Christmas or Happy Easter. Other folks only take what they want from the boxes but that allows us to give the deleted items to those with greater needs. It's a special two hours every time we distribute!

Everyone is welcome to help out. Prince of Peace is totally committed to this local community outreach mission.
