- <u>Prayer Ministry Team</u> Prayer Blasters (Circle of Intentional Caring). A break for the summer.
- <u>Financial Update</u> provided by Joy at RL Diocesan office Detail Trial Balance to June 13 2023 \$4888.09. The Anglican Healing Fund 2nd installment was received and is ready for our use for the year ahead. Good news!
- <u>Blessing/Caring Resource Bags</u>: Update on activities and next steps. 6 bags for Women and 6 bags for Children are ready for gifting. More resources are coming in now from parishes. Gaps will be filled using Wechetowin funds for a Fall stuffing session.
- Food Pantry/ with St. Benedict's Table: new partnership developed. Rev. Tanis will be going to St. Bens to highlight the partnership. They are wishing to connect with community regarding food security and help with basic need items, and we at Wechetowin are a good flow- through spot with our connections to community organizations and to the community in the heart of the north end where Epiphany Indigenous Anglican church is located. Discussion on the location of the Food Pantry for easy access and connections to people beyond the church walls. Main Foyer, with shelving will be used. Tanis will view the closed shelving units at St Ben's to see a sample of works well for them. Pick up and delivery of food will be a collective effort. Tanis is near by at the UW, so St. Ben's/All Saints is very close by for connection points. Krista is also at both churches regularly, so we will make this happen. This is awesome! Food will be smudged and sent out back into the community by either folks helping themselves or gifting back into the front line agencies that can use our support.
- Connections with community: (Community Resource List has continued to grow) Our list is now 7 pages long and we pray for three organizations per month. Part of that is connecting with them. Rev. Tanis calls them for a conversation and lets them know we are praying for their work and efforts. How can we help?
