As we read the Psalms, there will likely be ones that we do not feel we can immediately relate to. What is the purpose of these psalms? Why is it important to remember that the Psalms are not just for personal use but are also meant to be a communal prayer/song?

What truths in this Psalm encourage your heart? Which truths challenge you?
