
It's time for a New Directory!

AMERICAN LUTHERAN FALL INVITATION TO THE MUSIC MINISTRY

The term RECRUITMENT can often convey that there is work to be done. Regarding the music ministry, we work very hard at what we do, but we also support and minister to each other, provide friendship and offer the gifts God has given us to lead in Worship. Recruitment is filling positions, growing the group, and expanding the organization. The dictionary puts it in these terms:

Main Entry: re·cruit·ment Pronunciation:\ri-'krüt-ment\

Function: *noun*Date: circa 1828

1: the action or process of recruiting

2: the process of adding new individuals to a population or subpopulation (as of breeding or legally catchable individuals) by growth, reproduction, immigration, and stocking; *also*: a measure (as in numbers or biomass) of recruitment

This definition is mundane, unappealing, and somewhat unattractive. If we want a ministry to grow through recruitment, we can use the tried-and -true recruitment process and hope our numbers will grow. However, I believe that there is another word that more accurately fits what we are genuinely doing:

Extending an INVITATION to join us in ministry!

In these terms, the dictionary defines invitation as:

Main Entry: in·vi·ta·tion Pronunciation:\,in-və-'tā-shən\

Function: *noun*Date: 15th century

1 a: the act of <u>inviting</u> b: an often-formal request to be present or

participate.

As we invite individuals to join us, we are saying more than "You have a good voice; come and sing" or "We need more tenors," but "Would you like to come, sing, share in fellowship, and minister with us to each other and the congregation." This mindset seems to be more attractive and welcoming. If the response to an invitation is:

"But I cannot sing" – that's ok, we invite you to join us.

"But I cannot read music" – that's ok; many people cannot read music; we invite you to join us.

"I'm not sure what part I sing" – that's ok; we invite you to join us.

"But I look funny" – that's ok; we invite you to join us.

"I do not speak some of those funny languages you sing in sometimes" – that's ok; we invite you to join us.

The point is that our music group is more than just a choir. We minister to each other daily; we minister to the congregation; we are a family within the church; we love to raise our voices to the Lord!

The same holds for handbells. Even if you are musically illiterate, we can find a way to teach you to be successful. It is my hope that if there is enough interest this fall, we can launch a beginner handbell ensemble. Might you have a desire to learn something new?

As we move toward the new music season, I invite you to experience the joys of being a music ministry member for the first time or as a previous member. Consider where God may be calling you to in ministry. This is more than simply a music-making program but a faithful ministry. We do not perform in church but minister. Minister to the congregation and each other.

The year will be full of surprises and challenges, but we **INVITE YOU** to join us and celebrate the joy and gift that God has blessed us with. Join us in the ministry of music!
