The 2023 T.E.L.O.S. Mission Trip was a great success!

A group of 22 youth, leaders & chaperones transformed a shell of a house into what will be a home for Mimi and her adopted teens.

The group worked with TEAMeffort and Unconditional Love Ministries in Tennessee. Paint was scraped off the exterior of the house. Shutters and the exterior were primed then painted. The front door was fixed to block both light and insects from entering in gaps around it. Slick wooden entry stairs were scrubbed clean. On the inside, the group worked in the kitchen. dining room, living room, two bedrooms, a hallway and small laundry/storage area. Interior doors were removed, painted then rehung. The kitchen needed wallpaper borders removed and the rough patches spackled/sanded. The kitchen, living room, dining room, both bedrooms, and the hall were all primed and painted. The trim was painted as well as the ceilings in these 6 areas. A wall in the laundry/storage area was removed then rebuilt with sturdy wood beams.



The homeowner, Mimi, will be framing a photo of the group in her home once the Certificate of Occupancy is approved. All who worked on the transformation signed the mat that will go around the photograph.

OUR MISSIONS COMMITTEE AT WORK FOR YOU PART ONE - LOCAL

Matthew 25: 37-40 Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?"

The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (NIV)

The ECC Missions Committee are wonderful stewards of the money that you give through your pledges and offerings throughout the year and the food you donate weekly and during holiday food drives. They really stretch the money that they receive to help with many ministries on behalf of all of us at Ellington Congregational Church. This article is to help you become familiar with some of those organizations that are regular recipients of your generosity.

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE MONEY YOU GIVE THAT THE MISSION COMMITTEE HANDLES?

TELOS: Starting at our own church, our Missions Committee contributed \$2,500 to the TELOS Mission Trip to Athens, Tennessee in July. That covered the cost of one van – two full size and one smaller vehicle were needed to transport 22 people. This is valuable program that ECC offers to high school students to perform hands-on mission work in US areas in need each year.

The TELOS program contributes to the Christian education of young adults while contributing meaningful and needed work in the wider community.

Additional Food: Because food is in constant need, many times the committee will supplement your weekly food donations by purchasing perishable food items for these same organizations.

Ellington Human Services: In addition to running their food pantry, they offer many programs to meet the needs of Ellington families and senior citizens, from transportation to tax assistance. Our Missions Committee has provided additional support to them through donations for mental health for children, a summer barbeque, Christmas gifts for 3 seniors in need, and gift cards for Christmas gifts. Cornerstone Community Kitchen: 15 Prospect Street, Rockville. The Missions Committee buys food such as 50 pounds of hamburger at a time and other perishable items, and delivers it to the kitchen which serves lunch every day and dinner Monday through Friday, to typically 40 – 50 people. Many times, the committee is responding to last minute urgent requests from Cornerstone. (Carolyn Bunick is currently organizing an ECC Team to help with meal prep and serving once a month.)

Cornerstone Shelters and Cornerstone Clothing Bank: Cornerstone operates 3 shelters, and a clothing bank which the Mission Committee also supports. The special birthday bag donations, personal hygiene supplies, and paper goods that you give help these shelters.

The Hockanum Valley Community Council Food Pantry: This organization offers many services to local families such as counseling, case management, and transportation. Your offerings have helped the

committee to donate toward mental health support for children, elder care, and mental health support for adults. Their website is https://www.hvcchelps.org/

Hands On Hartford is another outstanding organization supported by our Missions Committee. They provide food, shelter and health programs to people in need in Hartford. One of their many programs is Gather55, a pay-what-you-can restaurant with options for paying the posted price or a minimum of \$2.00 and volunteer opportunities. They also have vouchers for those who cannot pay or volunteer. Our Missions supports Gather55, but if you are moved to help in one of our own cities in Connecticut, there are many opportunities to help Hands on Hartford. Walk Against Hunger: The committee was able to sponsor a church member's efforts to raise funds for CT Foodshare.

Vernon Human Services receive our support for back-to-school clothes and gift cards for Christmas gifts.

Maple Street School in Vernon receives backpacks, water bottles and socks for children in need.

MEET THE COMMITTEE - BOARD OF DEACONS

This month we are featuring the Board of Deacons. This Board, along with the Pastor, work cohesively as a group to guide the congregation in spiritual life.

The Board of Deacons plays an important role in the church. We foster spiritual development of individuals and the congregation as a whole. By planning a variety of services, we hope to reach and satisfy our congregants' need for spiritual development. There are a number of different duties performed by the Deacons which help to ensure this happens.

Deacons are responsible for the administration of the Sacraments, the preparation and serving of Communion, and assisting the Pastor with baptisms. We also visit congregants who are home-bound, serving communion to those who wish to receive it.

When visitors are in attendance, the Deacon on Duty approaches the visitor(s), making sure he/she they/them are comfortable in having everything they need for service. In addition, the Deacon then will invite him/her they/them to the Social Hour and introduce the visitors to our congregants.

Another important role of the Deacons is to welcome new members and attend the New Members meeting to share the scope of the Diaconate duties. We then work with the new members, along with Growth and Nurture and the Pastor, to help assimilate them into the congregation.

There also are several special church service roles for which the Deacons are responsible. These include the services and activities associated with Lent and Easter Seasons that are especially spiritual. The Deacons assist the Pastor on Ash Wednesday, helping with the delivery of the Ashes. The Service of Tenebrae is especially moving for those who have attended. Our Tenebrae Service takes place on Maundy Thursday and recounts the somber events that led up to Jesus' burial on Good Friday. During this season, we are also responsible for encouraging people to sign up to be a part of the Prayer Vigil which begins at noon on Good Friday and concludes Easter Morning at 6:00 AM.

During Advent, we prepare the Advent Wreath. It is during this time we are preparing as a church for the coming of Christ. Advent leads us to Christmas with the beautiful service of Christmas Eve. Deacons assist with offering Communion at the 10:00 P.M. service. Each year the Deacons plan and attend a retreat that focuses on spiritual renewal. This is an important time for us to connect with each other, to strengthen our bonds, and to set goals for our upcoming year.

Last but not least, we are responsible for several formal coffee hours throughout the year such as the New Members Coffee Hour and the Confirmand Reception.

Serving our faith community by being on this board is extremely fulfilling. If you have a strong commitment to worship and a desire to be a part of the spiritual development of our church, please consider becoming a Deacon. You can contact Pastor Joanne, Jane Scordato or Beth Tautkus.

Trustees CornerAugust 2023

James 1:17: Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows.

There are several projects happening at the church right now, under the purview of the Trustees. First, we are continuing to have the fire doors brought up to code. Additionally, the Trustees have accepted a bid to replace the wooden exterior doors (side entrance near the driveway) with metal doors that look similar, because the wooden doors are not repairable.

The toilet paper dispensers have been replaced!

The office safe will also be replaced because the locking mechanism is worn and nonreplaceable.

The oil rebate program is underway. The details are on our website. Our church receives a rebate based on the purchases by the congregation, and the pricing is advantageous to the congregation, as well. This is a win-win for our friends and members as well as the church.

The emergency lighting is being replaced with new LED units. Also, the Trustees have accepted a bid from Earthlight Technologies to update the remaining interior lighting in the church. This does not include the sanctuary, which was already done. The total cost with Earthlight is \$11,943 and the energy-savings incentive from Eversource is \$9,276. The net cost will be \$2,667 and the estimated energy savings will pay for the net cost in under two years.

There is a 60- inch television now located in the nursery, which is set up for watching our Sunday service via livestream, just as some currently do from home. The television has been mounted on the wall. Thank you to the Guilds for their donation of the television.

Finally, the exterminator came in July to deal with carpenter ants at the church. So, that issue should now be resolved
