

### **Barrily Worth Mentioning**

There are parts of the Bible that I just don't get. And if I'm honest with myself, there are some parts of the Bible I find myself sideways with. That 10th verse in Psalms 46 is one of those that gets caught in the throat of my soul. "Be still and know that I am God!" Well, who on earth can do that? In fact, which of us wants to do that – Be still? The only time I want to be still is when I'm put in a 6-foot box for the first and last time. Activity is what I like, seek, and thrive on. I like to be busy. I'm rewarded for being busy. Productivity in every job is measured by activity that produces results. No one in the world gets paid or promoted to be still - unless it's a mattress tester for Serta. I crave noise, action, involvement and all that goes with it. Be still? Not for me.

The truth is stillness is a bit frightening. When I get home, I suspect I'm a lot like most of you – I turn something on – the radio, TV, Sonos, a play list – something because silence is something I tend to avoid. I suspect a lot of us fall into this category. We dislike silence and stillness. If there's a lull in the conversation, we feel a need to fill the gap with words. If the YouTube we are watching goes quiet because it's buffering, we get annoyed. I know from present day circumstances that an empty house is really hard to adapt to, perhaps the hardest – because you are not only alone, but you and I miss the noise and activity.

So why 'be still"? I suspect it's for all the reasons I just mentioned. God can't be heard amid the noise and blur of activity. The truth is, I suspect that's the reason we try to stay busy and surround ourselves with Surround Sound. We are, if we are honest with ourselves, often afraid to meet God. If God is in the stillness, well, maybe I'll pass. What if God wants me to do something, or stop doing something? What if God wants to have a closer relationship with me but I don't have the time, and maybe the inclination, to be close to God. After all, one can't be around God for very long and remain the same. And who among us really wants to change, especially when things seem to be going so well?

But there it is – be still? You know why God says this. It's because God does want to be close to us. God wants an intimate relationship. And God even wants you and me to change because God has something better for us than what we presently think is the best of all worlds. But to have it, we'll have to be still.

There's a great "call" story or a "call back" story about Elijah in First Kings chapter 19. Elijah is pushed to his limits. Jezebel is hunting for his hide. He's about to give up and "poor me" stories flood his head. So, God has him go to a mountain top and promises to pass by him. And then the fireworks begin – a great wind, then an earthquake, and then a fire. Afterwards there is "the sound of sheer silence". After each calamitous event there is an announcement – "But God was not in the wind", or "God was not in the earthquake", or "God was not in the fire." God was not in the wild and noisy. God was in the stillness. This is where God is usually found. And if you enter it, you may well find not only God, but yourself.

### WHAT EPWORTH KIDS ARE EXPLORING IN SEPTEMBER



**Elementary**: This month, Epworth's Elementary kids will meet at 9:45 in the children's wing and explore God's Big Story. In September we will focus on what the Bible teaches us about Freindship! You don't need to attend a junior high band concert to know that learning to work together in harmony with others takes practice! Just because people are brought together because of a similar interest in soccer or because they're in the same grade at school, doesn't mean they'll instantly become great friends. To have good friends, you need to be a good friend and the Bible has many stories that are meant to teach us what a good friend looks like! Here's how we define this month's life app **Friendship: Using your words and actions to show others you care.** During their large group worship and small group discussion time the kids will focus on this month's memory verse "A friend loves at all times. They are there to help when trouble comes. (Proverbs 17:17)"

Our prayer this month is that your elementary kids begin to take these God-size ideas about friendship to heart and make some harmony together!



**Preschool & Toddler**: This month, we continue our in-person gatherings during all Sunday morning worship services with hands-on, action-packed large group/small group time. Epworth's Preschool and Toddler kids will explore the Biblical truth: **God knows what's best for me.** This month's theme will help your early childhood kiddos explore how to make good choices! By age 3, kids are faced with about 3,500 choices every day – everything from what to have for a snack to whether to share their new toy or tell a lie about how the crayon marks got on the wall. By the time they're adults, the number of choices jumps to about 35, 000 each day! So, we want to help your children learn from a young age that they can rely on God when they hav tough choices to make in their lives! During their Bible story time, they will work on memorizing this month's Bible Memory Verse: "God . . . knows everything." (1 John 3:20) It is our prayer is that after hearing Bible stories like Adam and Eve, Moses, Jonah, and Naaman your little one will remember that God loves us, and they trust that God knows what's best for us.



### **HAWKINS NEWS**

The 2023-24 school year began August 17 for Epworth-Hawkins Partnership volunteers. Members of the Hawkins leadership team attended a morning staff meeting, and volunteers assisted with registration of families attending an evening open house. Classes began for students on August 21 and we expect to receive teacher referrals for tutoring in mid-September.

Kindergarten Family Night is also scheduled for September (the exact date will be set after consultation with kindergarten teachers). At this event, the Epworth Hawkins Partnership gives each kindergarten family in attendance a book to read with their child. Epworth volunteers provide childcare while kindergarten teachers talk to parents/guardians about the benefits of reading with your child. The evening concludes with a pizza meal for all family members.

The Reader Bag program for students in grades 1 and 2 will resume in September. Students can borrow a bag with two age-appropriate books every week. When the bag is returned, the student can borrow two different books. Volunteers check in and distribute books weekly.

A new program planned for October will be a Second Grade Family Literacy Night at the Reynolds Corners branch library. Library staff will share early literacy resources with families and the Epworth-Hawkins Partnership will provide pizza, beverages, and gift cards as an attendance incentive.
