WELCA

On September 10, we had 15 kids and 12 adults to participate on Rally Sunday & "God's Works, Our Hands". The project was to fill Lutheran World Relief School Kits. We were able to fill 65 bags. We had already received supplies & bags filled for 36 more school kits. We still have some supplies, and if anyone still has supplies or a filled school bag you may drop them off in the tote in the entryway anytime up to October 15. If you don't want purchase supplies, you may donate money for the shipping of these kits in the container also in the entryway. Thank you to all who have donated supplies or filled school bags for Lutheran World Relief.

We are still collecting t-shirts, sizes large and larger, we use these to make cloth diapers for the Baby Kits for Lutheran World Relief. Just leave them on the cupboard counter in the WELCA room.

You may drop off any double, queen, or king size cotton sheets; we use the colored ones for the backs of quilts, & with the white ones we make pillowcases for comfort pillows.

I just received news from the Southeaster Iowa Synodical Women's Organization that the Churchwide Women of the Church have selected Des Moines, Iowa as the next location for the Triennial Convention & Gathering to be held in 2026. That is a wonderful privilege to be selected, so I am sure we will be asked to help with a variety of jobs in the future.
