ADVENT WREATH PRAYER

The following is a resource to help you connect with the themes of Advent & continue your prayers through the week. This can be done on your own or in the family group. This liturgy is based on Home Prayers found in the Book of Alternative Services (p. 687). If you do not have a prayer book, please take & keep one for your use.

Our devotions will centre around the great song of Mary \dot{c} the ancient O Antiphons that have been sung with it. The O Antiphons use a variety of images to wonder about Jesus. We know these Antiphons primarily through the great Advent hymn, O come, O Come Emmanuel.

1. The Preparation

The First (Blue) Advent candle is lit as someone prays,

Author of light, yours is the morning \mathcal{D} yours is the evening. Let Christ, the Sun of righteousness, shine for ever in our hearts \mathcal{D} draw us to your light. **Amen.**

2. The Reading & Reflection

Read the passage from Scripture then reflect using the wonder questions as your guide. This guide uses the New Revised Standard Version.

O WISDOM - LUKE 1:46-55 & ISAIAH 11:2-3

The First Antiphon – O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from one end of the other, mightily \dot{C} sweetly ordering all things: Come \dot{C} teach us the way of prudence.

I wonder how Mary's song reveals the kind of wisdom God has.

O ADONAI - LUKE 1:46-55 & ISAIAH 11:4-5

The Second Antiphon – O Adonai, & leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush & gave him the law on Sinai: Come & redeem us with an outstretched arm.

I wonder how God's law helps us.

O ROOT OF JESSE – LUKE 1:46-55 & ISAIAH 11:1, 10

The Third Antiphon − O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings will shut pheir mouths, to you the nations will make their prayer: Come & deliver us, & delay no longer.

I wonder what kind of king Jesus is.

O KEY OF DAVID - LUKE 1:46-55 PSAIAH 22:22

The Fourth Antiphon – O Key of David & sceptre of the House of Israel; you open ♂ no one can shut; you shut & no one can open: Come & lead the prisoners from the prison house, those who dwell in darkness & the shadow of death.

I wonder what kinds of imprisonments lesus frees people from.

O MORNING STAR – LUKE 1:46-55 & ISAIAH 9:2

The Fifth Antiphon − O Morning Star, splendour of light eternal & sun of righteousness: Come & enlighten those who dwell in darkness & the shadow of death.

I wonder what it means to dwell in darkness.

O KING OF THE NATIONS – LUKE 1:46-55 & ISAIAH 28:16

The Fifth Antiphon − O King of the nations, & their desire, the cornerstone making both one: Come & save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

I wonder what it means that all people are made of clay.

O EMMANUEL – LUKE 1:46-55 & ISAIAH 7:14

The Fifth Antiphon − O Emmanuel, our king & our lawgiver, the hope of the nations & their Saviour: Come & save us. O Lord our God.

I wonder what it means to say that God is our saviour.

JESUS IS BORN - LUKE 2: I-20

The day before we gather together to celebrate the birth of Jesus, take some time to reread the story of Jesus' birth. Place yourself in the story. What character do you want to be? What do you see?

I wonder how you are part of the story of Jesus' birth.

3. Prayers & the Lord's Prayer

Pray the Advent litany from the Book of Alternative Services (page 119). The liturgy concludes with the Lord's Prayer.
