1. The universality of sin

2. Read Romans 6:15-23.
  - a. What are the differences between a slave of sin and a slave of God? Identify the differences from the passage.
  - b. If our old self is dead, and we are no longer a slave to sin, why then do we still experience a continual struggle with sin in our lives?
