



Smudging is the burning of one or more medicines gathered from Mother Earth. Sage, tobacco, cedar and sweetgrass. We smudge to purify the body, mind, heart and spirit. It is the cleansing of ourself and connects us to our spirit and with the Creator. We smudge our head so we have only good thoughts and think in a good way. We then smudge our eyes, ears, and mouth, so we may only see, hear and speak well of others. Finally the feet, so we may continue to walk with great respect on Mother Earth.




WORKSHOP 1

LEADER: GEOFF WOODCROFT


"So where did that musical idea come from?" our conversation will explore, test and discern songs that we discover within ourselves.






WORKSHOP 2


Writing words with The Word.



Commission.





WORKSHOP 5 OUTEL SAME OF SAME
