Message from our Conference Minister, David K. Popham, as appeared in the October, 2023 HCUCC bulletin.



With gratitude overflowing our hearts, the Conference Office can announce that this week the contributions to the 2023 Hawai'i Wildfires Fund have surpassed \$400,000. This represents gifts both great and small from folks across Hawai'i, the continental U.S., and Japan who are standing in solidarity with our Maui 'ohana and those directly and secondarily affected by the fires and their aftermath.

One log in the fireplace warms the corner, several logs in the fireplace warm the room. These generous gifts enable the Conference to be a partner in the long-term recovery of Maui.

Funds from the Conference office are already at work on Maui in various ways: delivery of poi, temporary housing, portions of down payments as individuals replace vehicles lost to the fire, and gift cards distributed through crisis centers for families to purchase items of immediate need. These donations also allow us to meet emerging needs such as back-to-school items for displaced children. Currently, we are still refining how to be a partner for long-term recovery but are looking at pastoral support for Maui pastors, material support for rebuilding, and support for the <u>Waiola Church</u> whose buildings were destroyed in the fire. We will also support the work of our congregations on Maui as they organize local responses to emerging needs.


