

SPEAKER AT WOMEN'S CONVENTION IN OCTOBER

Biographical Sketch: Beth A. Lewis

Beth is the Principal for Getting2Transformation, through which she serves as an independent director for several boards, as keynote speaker and workshop leader, and she provides consulting for both for-profit and not-for-profit organizations on financial and cultural transformation, strategy and governance.

She is also Executive Director for the PCPA (Protestant Church-Owned Publishers Association). In addition, she is President & CEO Emeritus of 1517 Media, the ministry of publishing of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), having served as CEO 2002 -2018. In 2015 the organization was named one of the Top Workplaces in Minnesota by the

Minneapolis Star Tribune and she was also recognized with the Women in Business Award by the Minneapolis/St. Paul Business Journal.

Prior to working for 1517 Media, Beth was an entrepreneur/owner of Computer Coach, Inc. in Boca Raton, Florida. Before that she worked in a wide variety of roles including CMO and general management for Time Warner, McGraw-Hill and Times Mirror.

Originally from Lexington, KY, Beth is a lifelong Lutheran. She attended the University of Kentucky and completed her undergraduate degree at Maryville University in St. Louis. She is also a graduate of the Advanced Management Program of the Harvard Business School. In May 2008, she received the Doctor of Divinity honorary degree from the Wartburg Theological Seminary.

Beth is a popular keynote speaker and teacher in faith-based and corporate gatherings on a wide variety of topics to assist organizational leaders: from turnaround strategies to strategic thinking to best practices in governance for boards of directors.

Since 2017, Beth has served as Chair of the Board of Directors for the Thrivent Credit Union. In addition, she served as Secretary and on the Executive Committee for the Luther Seminary Board of Directors. She also served on the Synod Council for the Northwest Washington Synod of the ELCA.

Beth is married to the Rev. Dr. Richard (Rick) Rouse, author of several books related to congregational life and mission. Beth & Rick are often invited together as speakers for church leaders. They are active at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Everett, WA. Beth and Rick have three adult children and four grandchildren.

Reflection on the Kingdom of God By Tina Georgeson

People were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them; and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. But Jesus called for them and said, Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it. (Luke 18: 15-17)

"Do not stop them" a phrase that has meaning for all of us. We all are welcome at the table; there is a seat waiting for all of us. However, just as the disciples tried to stop the children from seeing Jesus, we might sternly say, you are not welcome here; either in words or actions. How many people feel unwelcome or invisible in our congregations? With conscious effort, we are tasked to bring all to Jesus; the homeless, the different, the LBTGQ community, the disabled, children, youth and adults, all ethnicities, men and women — everyone. Our NW WA SWO Constitution states:

Article VI—Conventions

Section 2. Representation

Item 1. Voting members of a convention shall be the elected officers or SWO leaders and board members of the synodical women's organization and one voting member from each unit on the roll of this synodical women's organization.

Item 2. Those congregations not represented by a unit shall be invited to send to the regular convention one representative who shall have seat and voice.

AROUND THE SYNOD



Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Bellevue to sell to Habitat for Humanity



When I learned of their decision to sell their property valued at about \$5 million for only \$1 million to Habitat for Humanity, I decided that I wanted to learn more about this congregation.

This description of Holy Cross Lutheran is taken from their website:

"We are a church that rolls up its sleeves and gets to work, seeking justice, peace and change in the world while working in partnership with others who share a common vision of serving and loving the world. From our early days meeting in the old farmhouse (1960?) to our recent reclamation of the orchard and partnership with Habitat with Humanity, understanding and maintaining this amazing resource has been a gift."

I interviewed Ingrid Turner to learn more about her church and its tentative plans. She has been a member since about 2003 when they had 2 services. She was baptized Episcopalian and then joined the Lutheran church. Ingrid has been a member of the women's book group and a leader in the congregation. They did not have an active WELCA unit.

The church was established on February 5, 1961 when they purchased 4 acres of an original farm. Over time parcels from the original farm has been sold. St Margaret's Episcopal purchased what was the green house. Newport High School purchased a parcel that had been wheat fields. It is located near Factoria and Newport High School on a large piece of property (1.5 acres?) which includes an orchard of heirloom apples and a pea patch. The organic pea patch was started in 2010. Much of the produce grown is donated to a food bank. The orchard has been used for cider pressing and a partnership with "city fruit". Part of their property is being used for worship by a Korean (Lutheran?) congregation as well as a preschool and an apartment rental.

As it became apparent with their decreasing membership (currently about 12 members) that they would not be able to continue to maintain their property, they began to seek proposals from the community that would be a good fit with their mission and ministry. Some of these included teen transitional housing, Homestead, Bellevue Fire Department, and Habitat for Humanity.

The congregation voted on the proposal from Habitat for Humanity that would include 15 single family units (focusing on families at or below 80% average median income). This would include building a 3,000 sq. ft. worship/community space or remodeling the existing sanctuary. The current orchard, gardens and any landscaping would be maintained by the homeowner's association.

The purchase and sale will not be completed until the needed permits are obtained. I was inspired by their continued focus.

After the parade, which was well represented by churches from both Snohomish and Everett there where games for children and popups that provided a wide variety of items for sale, and food trucks to feed bodies. At the same time four churches offered to feed souls with prayer and communion.

In their booth you see from left to right, Father Nigel, Pastor at St John Episcopal Church, Rev. Addie, Associate Pastor, at Snohomish 1st Presbyterian Church and Pastor Craig, Christ the King Lutheran Church. I am not certain where pastors Charlie and Ann who are co-pastors at 1st Presbyterian, Pastor Charlie walked with us and



spent several hours in the booth as well. I'm looking forward to more of the same participation next year!



We didn't wait a year, Christ the King and the United Methodist Church joined for the second year, to put on the best Vacation Bible School in town in the last week of July.

Beginning in January, we worked together to create a program. Our theme was "Christmas in July!" We had everything you think of when you think of VBS: snacks, crafts, songs and stories about Jesus...including a live donkey for part of the day. Then we invited parents and grandparents to a pageant on Friday.

By the Monday of VBS we had over a hundred little angels registered - several more angels than our two churches had as members. We were ministering to the neighborhood. We were ecstatic.

They made pictures, quilts and wooden boats with the men from our Bible Study Group assisting. A professional actor directed the pageant and so many more taught and made the work easy.
