AN EXPANDED APOSTLES' CREED

This expanded Apostles' Creed is a tool to help contemporary Christians confront three challenges — fragmentation of the biblical story, temptation to live by alternative life-explaining stories, and pressure to keep Christian faith private. It includes the original Creed, but also draws on Scripture to fill in key parts of the Christian Story omitted in the original (such as the goodness of creation, humankind's rebellion against God with its creation-wide consequences, God's purposeful involvement with Israel in history, the exemplary life of Jesus the Messiah, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit who sustains us in the current age of mission, and the promise of a renewed earth).

The Apostles' Creed encourages those who use it to live lives shaped by the reality that one God in three persons — the Father, the Son, the Spirit — is the creator, saviour, sustainer, judge, and future hope of all people. We hope this expanded Apostles' Creed also encourages those who use it to value the gift of embodied life, to apply Christian faith to all aspects of life within the public sphere, and to care for God's good earth.

I believe in God, the Father almighty,

God's Intention

creator of heaven and earth,

who created the world very good,

and placed the first couple in Eden, a perfect home.

There they succumbed to temptation

and chose autonomy over obedience,

with consequences for the entire creation,

unleashing sin and destruction into God's good creation.

Exile

God responded by choosing Abraham,

through whom he vowed to recover his purposes for all nations.

From Abraham's descendants God formed his people Israel,

and placed them in the land of Canaan,

to be a showcase to the world of life under God's reign.

Israel's persistent disobedience led to the judgement of exile,

announced by the prophets,

who also proclaimed the coming day

when God through his Messiah would establish his kingdom.

I believe in Jesus the Messiah, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.
