Words of Remembrance

A Candle-Lighting Litany

ONE: [The 1st candle is lit] We light this candle to remember all those men and women who died in the service of Canada in times of war, on peacekeeping missions, and in conflicts in other countries. At the going down of the sun and in the morning...

ALL: We will remember them.

ONE: [The 2nd candle is lit] We light this candle to remember victims of war on all sides, especially the most vulnerable: women, children, LGBTQIA+, those who are sick and disabled, or elderly and those who are already rejected by their society. At the going down of the sun and in the morning...

ALL: We will remember them.

ONE: [The 3rd candle is lit] We light this candle to remember the service animals who died in support of the troops: the horses, the dogs, the carrier pigeons. At the going down of the sun and in the morning...

ALL: We will remember them.

ONE: [The 4th candle is lit] We light this candle for the families of all service people. We give thanks for the support and care they offered and continue to offer when their loved ones return home. We remember especially those who suffer from the traumatic effects of their service. At the going down of the sun and in the morning...

ALL: We will remember them.

ONE: [The 5th candle is lit] We light this candle for our earth and all of creation, recognizing that it, too, is a casualty of war. We acknowledge the ecological destruction of the earth, the sea, and the air, and pray that our Creator might help us to restore the ongoing devastation of our natural world. Loving God,

ALL: Make us instruments of your peace.

ONE: [The 6th candle is lit] We light this candle for the hundreds of thousands of refugees displaced by war who must seek new homelands, a safe and peaceful place to live, and a fresh start. Loving God,

ALL: Make us instruments of your peace.

ONE: [The 7th candle is lit] We light this candle as a candle of love to remind us that God commands us to forgive one another and to be reconciled to one another. Loving God.

ALL: Make us instruments of your peace.

ONE: [The 8th candle is lit] We light this candle because we believe Jesus is the light of the world. His light shines in the worst of times and nothing ever puts it out. Loving God,
