From obscurity, Leah Sharibu has been thrust upon the consciousness of mankind globally. Like a saint, Leah Sharibu, who was little known outside her immediate family in her time of freedom, has become a global phenomenon in her time in captivity. Leah Sharibu was one of the 110 teenage schoolgirls abducted by Boko Haram terrorists from a government school in the insurgency-ravaged North-East region of Nigeria in February 2018. However, the joy that heralded the negotiated release of 105 girls a month later was stifled when Leah Sharibu was not among those released. The reason for her continuous stay in captivity was on the basis of her professed Christian faith, which she was not ready to renounce for the Muslim religion.
