Sunday, December 3- Advent

Blue

Stir up your power, and come! The psalmist's plea in Psalm 80:2 has become familiar to us in the Advent prayers. Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open. Both cry out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. By your merciful protection awaken us to the threatening dangers of our sins, and keep us blameless until the coming of your new day, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Sunday, December 10- Advent

Blue

John calls people to repent, to clear the decks, to completely reorder their lives so that nothing gets in the way of the Lord's coming. The reading from Isaiah gives the context for this radical call: the assurance of forgiveness that encourages us to repent; the promise that the coming one will be gentle with the little ones. Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship, in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up our hearts, Lord God, to prepare the way of your only Son. By his coming strengthen us to serve you with purified lives; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Blue

"Rejoice always," begins the reading from 1 Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. "All God's children got a robe," go the words of a spiritual. It is not so much a stately, formal, pressed outfit as it is a set of party clothes, clothes we are happy to wear. We receive that robe in baptism, and in worship we gather for a foretaste of God's party.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up the wills of your faithful people, Lord God, and open our ears to the words of your prophets, that, anointed by your Spirit, we may testify to your light; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

In your mercy, let us share the divine life of the one who came to share our humanity, Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Pastoral Pondering ... The Nativity

Growing up one of my favorite preparations for Christmas, beyond putting up the tree and trains, was setting out our family nativity sets, indoor and outdoor. The indoor set was hand painted and always sat safely on our fireplace mantle. The outdoor nativity, had kid-sized characters. I could look the standing characters in the eye. Now, Pastor Dena and I have our own nativity traditions. The nativity sets we have are more portable. Less about the size, these nativities are uniquely hand-made. I have a couple sets made as wooden outlines, just enough detail to tell the characters apart, but plenty of room for imagination. Then we have a nativity that is made from olive wood, hand carved in the Holy Land. I like seeing nativities at the fair-trade store that reflect the Christmas story in artistic styles from around the world. Each set is unique and meaningful in different ways.

This past year we did not put our nativity set away. It stayed out continuing to remind us that the Christmas story lives among us all year. The story of Jesus' real and vulnerable presence in the world is an everyday reality. This year that has been especially intense with the violence occurring in the Holy Land. Seeing those handmade characters reminds me of the real people who they represent. Not just the holy family of Bethlehem, but the life-sized families, who search for shelter in the Holy Land and in all places rocked by violence. I pray for a day when their lives will be as peaceful and calm as beloved carols paint the first Christmas. This season will be different it must be until there is peace.

In the season of Advent, we take time to prepare for the Nativity or birth of Jesus.

Our preparations and celebrations stretch throughout the weeks of Advent and beyond, as they should. It is no small event when the God of all creation comes down and moves into the neighborhood. This global neighborhood is hurting and in need of deep healing

and handmade love. This season invites us to open our hearts to see the nativity anew. May we recognize the story of the nativity as it is lived out among God's people around the world as we work and pray for their peace, safety, and well-being. May we recognize the holy family in the eyes in our life-sized neighbors. May we know the Kid-sized Love of God's Kingdom that comes to earth in the baby of Bethlehem, given for you.

Sunday, October 29, 2023 following Worship

Call to Order: President Brenda Cooper

Devotions: Pastor Lee Gable read Martin Luther's Morning Prayer (from the Book of Concord).

Secretary's Report: Kelley Knutson's September 24 Minutes were approved electronically.

Treasurer's Report: Linda Nielsen

As of September 30, 2023

General Fund: \$50,451.08Building Fund: \$34,681.93Memorial Fund: \$115,364.34

Old Business Discussed:

At our September meeting, Council asked property for more information about potential solar energy at Fredsville. A second bid for adding solar panels to the church building was received. The two bids were compared. This will go to the property committee who will gather more details before they can make a recommendation to Council.

New Business Discussed:

- #1 As part of the Call process for a pastor, congregations pay moving expenses. St Timothy Lutheran, Hudson, paid the full cost when Pastor Dena and Pastor Lee moved to Iowa in 2022. Now that Fredsville has called Pastor Lee, we will pay half of the \$8,500 moving expenses.
- #2 Dennis Kruger dba Kruger Farms's bid of leasing the Fredsville farm for \$104,625 per year for the next two years was accepted.
- #3 The Kruger family donated a Mountain Ash Tree to Fredsville that was given to them in memory of Dennis. The four confirmation students planted this tree (coordinated by Sue Green) south the parsonage garage on 10/27/23. Note: The Mountain Ash tree is a different variety of Ash tree and is not affected by the Emerald Ash Borer.
- #4 "Pie Sunday" will be November 19, during fellowship.
- #5 Fredsville will have a booth at Dike's Razzle Dazzle on Wednesday, November 29th. "Peace" will be the theme of our activity. "Peace" is a very timely theme this year. Also, it makes sense that Fredsville promote "Peace" as "Peace" is part of our congregation's name. "Fred" means peace in Danish.
- #6 Brenda Cooper encouraged all Council members to volunteer in the Sunday Worship services and to ask a youth or Confirmation student to help them. She emphasized how important it is for the Council members to be visible.
- #7 It was decided not to have a Congregational Meal after church in December.
- #8 Since Christmas Eve is on Sunday this year, we will have one worship service, Christmas Eve Candlelight at 4:30pm.

#9 – A Christmas Day Devotional video will be made and sent out for December 25.

#10 — Sunday, December 31 worship will be prerecorded as Pastor Lee, Jeff and Meridith will all be on vacation.

Pastor Report:

#1 – The "Season of Creation" including the Prayer of Directions, was a good addition to worship this fall.

#2 – The wedding of Krissy Nielsen and Dominic Cipressi was celebrated on October 14. Four funerals were held.

#3 – The Sunday School leaders are enjoying using the new Sunday School curriculum. Fifteen students are participating in Confirmation. Kim Farley is assisting Pastor Lee. Confirmation meets the 1st and 2nd Wednesdays of the month.

#4 – Pastor Lee attended the Northeastern Iowa Fall Conference and has attended many conference meetings which has allowed him to connect with other ELCA pastors.

#5 – Pastor Lee has been working hard to get information about adding Solar to Fredsville.

#6 – Pastor Lee met informally with the Dike UMC and the Stout Reformed Pastors. Ministry efforts with the House of Hope, Salvation Army, Lutheran Lakeside Camp and Lutheran Service in Iowa (LSI) are being explored.

#7 – Pastor Lee has been updating Fredsville's digital ministry on Facebook.

#8 – Pastor Lee has been working with Treasurer Linda Nielsen to estimate the budget items for 2024.

Committee Reports:

Worship & Music – Pastor Lee, Jean Loger, Jeff & Meridith Sandlin have done some long-term planning for our worship services. The Funeral and Wedding handbook language and polices need to be updated.

Finance – Will be meeting in November to come up with a proposed budget for 2024.

Property Committee – Their next meeting will be on Monday November 6 @ 7 p.m. Solar panels for the church will be discussed.

Mutual Ministry – Will be meeting on either November 13 or November 27.

Closing Prayer: The Council Members said the Lord's Prayer in unison.

Next Meeting: Sunday, November 26th following Worship.


