This document offers liturgical suggestions for Lent in connecting with PWRDF and the Diocese of New Westminster's focus on the "Development Work of PWRDF" involving **Clean Water projects in Tanzania and Food Security in Cuba**. In both countries, PWRDF works with church-based development partners. Stories about the partners and their projects are included in this mailing for your use during Lent.

Parishes are encouraged to invite a special offering to one or both of these areas during Lent. Your gifts need to be clearly marked on your envelope indicating the project(s) you support. So make your envelopes either Food Security-Cuba or Water Projects-Tanzania or both.

As indicated on the enclosed sheet regarding the story "Growing Food as an Act of Worship – Food Security in Cuba, there will be further material sent to each parish. This material will be by a separate mailing with an opportunity to be part of a diocesan wide initiative to provide funds for building a greenhouse (part of the Food Security- Cuba initiative) in the parish in Cuba where parish based small scale fresh food production began! Our own PWRDF delegates met with these folks and saw the work they are doing in Food Security! This initiative of supporting the greenhouse is a follow-up by members of our diocese of New Westminster's PWRDF Unit, who participated in the PWRDF Food Security Delegation to Cuba, March 2015.
