Advent, the beginning of the New Year for the church, is upon us. Just as with the calendar New Year, it is a time for reflection as well as looking forward. These might include following the readings more closely, attending church more regularly and increasing our prayer life. 'Advent' comes from the Latin *advenire* to *adventus*, meaning arrival. The word 'Adventure' comes from the same Latin root *advenire* but to *adventurus*, meaning about to happen. Adventure is an unusual and exciting experience or activity, which may have some risk. Are we ready to embark on an adventure? Perhaps we can say that the period of Advent concerns not just looking forward to the coming Jesus, but also, for us, the arrival of a new adventure, in whatever form this may take! Happy Advent!!

FINANCES:

Giving Sunday December 3rd:

As Br. Michael has so eloquently reminded us over the last month: "Through these seasons of stewardship, our thinking about giving has shifted from the realm of obligation to the realm of gratitude and love. And our thinking about stewardship itself has shifted from being primarily a matter of dollars and cents, to being a matter of time, gifting, money, relationships, and the Gospel. I am convinced that discerning what God is up to requires cultivating a unique set of skills. When we think about giving, or serving, or any other area of stewardship, we tend to start-or at least I do-with looking at how much financial wiggle room we have, or which nights of the week we're available. Those are great financial literacy and personal care skills, but they aren't the skills we start with when wondering about what God is up to, and what part we get to play in it. If we want to take seriously that God is inviting us to join him in what he's doing in Red Deer, then that invitation is where we need to start the conversation." Whatever you have decided is right for you is completely acceptable. Remember that if you are unable to be in church on December 3rd, these donations can be made at any time over the month. Please remember to signify any specific gifts as Giving Sunday gifts. You may have also been led to increase your regular giving by a certain amount and this is also very helpful.

We have benefitted from a generous donation this month. We give thanks for all who, in whatever way possible, contribute to the help cover the expenses of keeping the church building and all its programmes functioning. If you are interested in changing to pre-authorized giving, please contact Barb at the church office and she will provide you with the necessary form. We are also continuing to pick up donations weekly from the mailbox at the church and a number of parishioners are making donations via Interac e-transfer. If you would like to use this method, please enter offerings@oldchurchrd.com as the recipient email address. If you are usually an envelope user, you can enter your envelope number in the comments section or if it is for a specific use, such as Heat the Church or Flowers, you can mark that in the comments section. This is an automatic deposit so there is no security question. Heat the Church: Just as it is important to continue giving our regular donations to the church, those who wish to contribute to this fund can do so by putting an envelope marked Heat the Church in the offering plate on Sunday, under the donate button on the website or by e- transfer as outlined above. The suggested donation is \$25 for a day. It is not just in the winter we encourage this, as the daily rate is averaged over the year. In terms of the heat in the Hall, if you or your group have an event and you turn up the heat, please turn the thermostat back to 18 when you are finished.

Flower Donations:

While the flowers beautify the church, they are also used by Altar Guild as part of their parish outreach, as after the service they are delivered to people in the parish. Thank you to all who have already signed up for donations. We do not have flowers in Advent. A new calendar will be put up before the end of 2023 for donations in 2024.

Prayer Chain Ministry: The Prayer Chain Ministry at St. Luke's Church has been initiated to provide a one-on-one connection to individuals with emergency situations through the gift of prayer. Prayer requests for yourself, or "consented to" prayers for others, are kept in strictest confidence and can be handwritten and placed in the prayer box at the back of the church, or submitted by contacting the Prayer Chain Coordinator at prayerchain@oldchurchrd.com. (email addresses are kept confidential and never shared with others) Prayers will be initiated within 24 hours following receipt of the request and continued on a daily basis for two weeks. After that time the Prayer Chain Coordinator will contact the requestor to determine whether further prayer is required, or if the prayer request needs to be updated. "For surely, I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you."
