Listening as we Gather

Welcome and Land Acknowledgement

ONE: Let us pause for a moment and consider our role in reconciliation.

ALL: First United Church resides on treaty lands known as the Haldimand Tract, which straddle either side of the Grand River, from Lake Erie all the way to north of Shelburne, and upon the traditional territory of **Chonnonton*, Anishinaabe, and Haudenosaunee people. We recognize this gathering place where we worship and serve is home to many past, present, and future First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples. May our honouring of the land and worship of Creator this day plant a seed that will grow into relationships of justice and healing between settlers and Indigenous peoples in our midst.

*The Neutrals' name for themselves was Chonnonton, or 'people of the deer.' They were called Attawandaron by the Huron, meaning 'people whose speech is awry or a little different'.

ONE: We aspire to create a safer space for everyone. We welcome you and the gifts you bring as part of your sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, race, cultural background or abilities.

Opportunities for Ministry and Fellowship

• Introit/Candle Liturgy:

ONE: In a world filled with tragedy and chaos, we arrive weary, wary, and wrung out. ALL: We come to find shelter from our fears, to discover hope as we practise our faith in worship.

ONE: We're tired of this marathon of difficulty, longing for relief through a return to what we once thought normal.

ALL: We come because the vulnerable Christ child enlightens us with possibility.

ONE: On this first Sunday of Advent, we light this first candle symbolizing hope—the assurance that the risen Christ transforms all things in love.

(The first blue candle is lit.)

ALL Sing: Hope Is a Star, (vs. 1)

ONE: Flickering and fragile, this tiny flame opens us to wonder, to the heart of God, which transforms us as we join together in prayer:

ALL: We come to be sustained in life, O God, even as we wrestle. Inspire us to perceive the Way of Jesus as the path of wholeness. Unite us to become a community of faith woven as one by the Spirit. Teach us how to live by loving-kindness, becoming catalysts for hope in the hearts of those we encounter. Amen.

• CALL to Worship

ONE: Hear ye, hear ye, good people!

ALL: What news?

ONE: Good news, which shall be for all people!

ALL: Good? How?

ONE: See the Anointed one comes! In the breath of wind, she whispers. In the feel of grass and leaves, he reaches out. In the transformation of ice to water to ice, they sing. In starlight and candle flame, the way is lit.

ALL: We reach for the presence of God.

ONE: We are thirsty for the water of peace, the light of hope, the wind of joy, the ground of love. Good News! The Anointed one comes! The Anointed One comes from God, whose love for us is everlasting!
