Grace and peace to you!

December, 2023

As we begin December, we enter the season of Advent, a time of waiting and preparation for Christmas, Christ's coming, the Incarnation. We often fling ourselves full force and full speed ahead into the preparation for Christmas. We have our shopping lists and our "to do" lists in hand. Raking fall leaves gives way to putting up lights and decorations. Trees go up. Cookies get baked. Guest rooms are made ready for visitors. Preparation becomes a major focus. But, for what or whom are we really preparing? For whom or what do we wait?

Christmas is about the Incarnation, God taking on flesh, God's child becoming one of us as human. Christmas is about the love of God being poured out for the sake of all creation with the birth of a baby in Bethlehem. If we think about that night, how prepared were Mary and Joseph? They didn't have a place to stay when they arrived and took shelter in an animal stall. They didn't have a midwife on call to deliver their baby. They had left the receiving blankets, child safety seat, and stroller back in Nazareth. But guess what. That baby came anyway. They had been waiting, to be sure, but weren't quite prepared. Yet, that didn't thwart God's plan.

We might wonder if our waiting might be overshadowed by our preparing. Preparation keeps us busy and can be distracting, but if we think about the places or situations in which we wait – a doctor's office, the DMV, the airport – there isn't much for us to do but read, or think, or contemplate, maybe listen to music. Waiting slows us down so that all those more thoughtful pursuits take priority and perhaps give us more time to focus on what is at the heart of things.

During this Advent time, we would benefit by intentionally building some waiting time into our busy schedules – time to slow down and think about the reason for all of our preparation. Is it just for the celebratory time with family and friends at Christmas. Is it all about shopping and gifts? Is it all about having our houses in good order and decorated to a T? Or is it about Jesus, the Incarnation, God taking on flesh, God's love come down to and for all humanity?

After all is said and done, despite all the trappings of the seasons that are part of our preparation, Christ has and will come. Let's take time to wait and truly prepare for his coming into our hearts, into our lives, into our community. May we all enjoy a thoughtful, joyful, loving and blessed Advent and Christmas season.



# WORSHIP ON SATURDAYS, 5PM\* & SUNDAYS, 9AM

**Worship** services' orders of worship will be the same, except when we celebrate a *Holden Evening Prayer* service at 5:00pm Saturdays and a Contemporary\* led service at 9:00am Sundays. Worship materials include using the ELW hymnal, printed bulletins, announcement sheets, etc. Printed material available online at our church's website under "uploaded documents".

Holy Communion at the railing or from your seat as needed; on weekends that are Holden/Contemporary (2nd Sunday each month) communion will be by intinction. Gluten-Free or regular wafer, wine or juice offered. Children who haven't received instruction yet, or anyone not receiving communion may come forward for a blessing instead. Simply fold your hands when approaching.

Sharing of Peace during worship will now be up to you: [the people] you may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you" or similar words. You may consider a gesture without physical touch, perhaps a slight bow, or crossing arms over the chest, as a symbol of an embrace.


