
Worship with Us

4pm - Advent Lessons & Carols

This will be a beautiful service of music and readings for Advent. Where gospel and prophecy collide, we can bear witness to the great story arch of God's redeeming love. Together, we journey with the prophets towards Bethlehem.

2pm - Senior's Christmas Eucharist & Tea Dec. 13th

Start off your Christmas season at St. Mary's by marking your calendars to attend the Seniors' Christmas Eucharist and Tea, on **Wednesday, December 13**th at 2:00 pm. Plan on joining us, and perhaps bring along a friend. This will be a festive service with the familiar hymns we love and Eucharist, then we will gather in the Parish Hall to enjoy a special afternoon tea (and coffee) with friends old and new. 7pm - Longest Night Service

Thursday, Dec. 21st

Christmas is generally celebrated as a time of joy and fun. But many of us struggle during the holiday season. The Longest Night service (also sometimes called Blue Christmas) gives an opportunity to acknowledge the struggle with darkness and grief we face in our life because we are mourning the death of a loved one, or are feeling lonely or isolated, or are struggling with the pain, need, and suffering we see in the world around us. This quiet, beautiful service will offer opportunities to acknowledge our grief and pain as well as to focus on the promise of hope found in Christ.



Christmas Eve - December 24th

3pm - Family Christmas Eucharist & Pageant

Everyone - the young and young at heart - are all welcome to participate in the pageant. No rehearsal required! Costumes will be available in the Narthex. After the pageant, we'll further celebrate Jesus' birth by having a simplified communion together (the bread and/or the wine). This service is great for families with little ones, or for those who love participating in a Christmas pageant and seeing a Nativity tableau.

7pm - Christmas Eucharist

This service will feature contemporary language, along with carols, choir, and candles as we welcome the Christ child! This lively service is great for those wishing to participate in singing familiar tunes and prayers, with all the magic of Christmas Eve.

11pm - Festive Choral Eucharist

Embrace the beauty, mystery and awe this Christmastide. Our Festive Choral Eucharist will feature traditional choral music, a chanted Eucharist, traditional language, and candlelight. This elegant service will suit those nostalgic for a Christmas midnight gospel.

Christmas Day... and beyond

10am - Christmas Day

Monday, Dec. 25th

This Christmas morning, at 10am, there will be a beautiful and simple Holy Eucharist to celebrate and share in the joy and peace that come with Jesus' birth. (*There will be no 8am service on this day.*)

10am - Feast of the Holy Name

Monday, Jan. 1st

We are delighted to welcome **Rev. Dr. Rob James**, Associate Professor at VST, as our presider and preacher for this service. Traditionally January 1st (which is 8 days after Christmas) is celebrated as the feast of the Holy Name to commemorate the naming of the baby Jesus. The gospel of Luke tells us at the end of eight days he was circumcised and called Jesus - the name given by the angel before he was conceived.

Christmas Lessons and Carols

Friday, Jan. 5th

Come, share a final Christmas feast – in this case, a feast of words and music, marking the completion of our Christmas season. Outside, the carols may have stilled and the bustle now focused on Boxing Week sales, but inside the church we are still celebrating the Incarnation.

CDC Christmas Tree Fundraiser

Each year, the Community Donations Committee (CDC) selects two charities to support with a special appeal.

We encourage parishioners to make a donation either:

Each donation is then represented by an ornament on our Christmas Tree in the Parish Hall. **We want to cover the tree with decorations!** This year's fundraiser will be up and running during Sunday Coffee Hour on **December 3rd, 10th, and 17th.**



This year we have chosen Coast Mental Health and the Lookout Society as our two charities.

Coast Mental Health provides essential housing, support, and employment services for people with mental illness, so they can find their meaningful place in our community - a place to live, a place to connect, and a place to work. (*coastmentalhealth.com*)

The Lookout Society provides housing and a range of support services to adults with low or no income who have few, if any, housing or support options. The Lookout Society operates many warming shelters around the city, and will be running the one at St. Mary's this winter. (*lookoutsociety.ca*)

Free Neighbourhood Pantry

The Free Pantry is now up and running. This is located just outside the office entrance. Parishioners (and all community members!) can put dry/non-perishable food goods, sunscreen, period products, etc. in it, and anyone can take what they need at no cost.

We are inspired by the Marpole Free Pantry's vision of "no policing, no shaming" of anyone using the pantry, in the recognition that an important goal of mutual aid & community support is to "build [...] and retain dignity."

This project is meant to be self-sustaining and build both connection and community by serving as a meeting place.

The SMK Free Pantry can accept:

- Dry goods, non-perishable food
- Period products pads, tampons, liners
- Toothpaste/toothbrushes, soap, and other general hygiene items
- Sunscreen, bottled water, and other products that help keep people safe in extreme weather conditions.

For safety reasons, the pantry **cannot accept** open, expired, or perishable goods.


Advent Study Group

Refugee Sponsorship Update

Update on the Siddiquis, our Afghan refugees

Freshta has now finished her 6-month contract with the law firm and is looking for another job. This is particularly pressing, as our financial support for Freshta and her mother, Adela, officially ends at the end of December, and they will be on their own.

Any connections or ideas that you might have for available positions for which Freshta could apply would be very gratefully received. She has four languages, a degree in Business Administration from the American University of Afghanistan, has worked on a contract for the European Union, and her qualifications have been accepted in Canada. Her resume is available upon request.

The lease for the apartment that we have been renting for Freshta and Adela is renewable on March 1st. We want to help them with the extra 2 months' rent to take them to the end of February. We are therefore appealing for further donations towards this, with immense gratitude for all the support you have offered up until now.

Freshta and Adela are so grateful to St. Mary's for our support – a recent message said they "would like to thank God for blessing me with family members like you guys".

Update on our Palestinian Family

The Palestinian refugees whom we have agreed to sponsor - Ahmad and Mirna Bader - are still waiting for their papers for coming to Canada. They are currently in Dubai and Ahmad has found a new job, working as a graphic designer for a real estate company. A small amount of furniture has already been received and is in storage, and some has been offered as is being held by the donor until the Baders' arrival. When we DO hear of their imminent arrival (which could be with as little as two weeks' notice) we will be sending out an urgent appeal for help with finding somewhere for them to live - even on a temporary basis.

- **E-transfer** to office@stmaryskerrisdale.ca or by credit card through our website transaction must be completed by 11:59pm on December 31st.
- **Cheque or cash** must be received in the offertory plate or secure drop box by 11am on December 31st.

Please note that envelopes left on the Office counter, etc. will be counted as received on the date that we locate them.
