UPDATE

As we near the end of 2023 and complete the first three months of wonderful *Matthew Mystery Project* activities I want to express my appreciation for the enthusiasm and support everyone has shown for this fundraising and community building initiative.

I'm pleased to announce that as of this week \$4977.50 has been returned to the Church as part of the *Matthew Mystery Project*. Some of that money is seed money, but the majority represents profits made by congregation members donating their time and talents to multiply the \$20 handed to them on October 1st. I know that there are many people who have held onto their profits using them to fund upcoming projects so the *MMP* money will continue to grow to help our Church next year.

The Matthew Mystery Project continues through to the end of April 2024 so there will be many announcements about new activities and projects in the new year but for now, thank you for your hard work and support of each other's efforts. We are very blessed!

The 20-Year-Reunion performance of a Celebrity Reading of Dickens' "A Christmas Carol" went off seamlessly. From the point of view of the Mathew Mystery project, the 17 folk who each 'invested" their \$20, saw a return to Comox United of over 780%.

The audience of 180 people gathered in the sanctuary really enjoyed the very talented reading.

The funds generated will be put to good use by Comox United, but the production also generated a substantial gift to Dawn to Dawn. Those funds will be used to support the opening of a safe, supportive, peer-run, transitional residence for Indigenous and non-Indigenous young people who are experiencing, or are at risk of becoming unhoused.
