Theme: The Lord Jesus Christ

Opening Explanation

Maranatha! **Come Lord Jesus!** These words of hope and expectation are the centre of the advent season, when we wait for the coming of Jesus – born in Bethlehem, crowned King of Heaven, alive in our hearts, and returning at the end of days.

On this, the day of Jesus' birth, we rejoice and give thanks to God for the coming of the Christ. Anticipated in Abraham and David, proclaimed by the prophets, attested to by John the Baptist, and born of the Virgin Mary, Jesus of Nazareth comes this day, King of God's creation, and infant in a manger. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. **Amen.**

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a

witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.
