

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

We pray for all those who are homeless, and those who seek a welcome in strange places.

All: May they find an open door and kindness within.

As we remember the shepherds watching over their flocks, we give you thanks for those who watch over us this night. We pray for all those who must work on holidays, tending the well-being of others.

All: May they know a blessing in the services they provide and our gratitude for their efforts.

As we remember the angels and their message of peace and goodwill, we are grateful for peace and order in our communities. We pray for all those who work to establish and maintain peace in troubled places and troubled lives, knowing trouble rarely takes a vacation.

All: May they be witnesses of God's greatest hope, that all may know God's reconcilling love and compassion for all people.

As we remember the Magi and the gifts they brought to honour the Christ Child, we thank you for the generosity that overflows at this time of year.

May it touch the lives that need it most.

All: May each of us find ways to offer you what we value most in the year ahead.

Hear these prayers

and all the silent prayers of our hearts, O God, and cradle them and us in your holy wisdom.

All: Amen.

The Preparation of the Table

Prayer over the Gifts

Priest: Generous Creator,

in faith and joy

we celebrate the birth of your Son.

Increase our understanding and our love of the riches you have revealed in him,

who is Lord now and for ever.

All: Amen.

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Priest: Blessed are you, Lord God,

our light and our salvation;

to you be glory and praise for ever.

From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise. In the fullness of time you made us in your image, the crown of all creation.

You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

(From Common Praise # 735)

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might.
Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full,
full of your glory.

Congregation may sit or kneel at this time.

Priest: How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord.
As a mother tenderly gathers her children,
you embraced a people as your own.
When they turned away and rebelled,
your love remained steadfast.

From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary, to be the living bread, in whom all our hungers are satisfied.

He offered his life for sinners, and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks.

He broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Priest: Father, we plead with confidence

his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand.

Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory.

Bring us at the last with St. Luke and all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise: Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever.

All: Amen. (Sung 5 times - From Common Praise # 737)

The Lord's Prayer (Please stand as you are able.)

Priest: In the words that our Saviour taught us, we pray:

hallowed be your name,

Priest:

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread (From Common Praise # 747)

All: Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.

Jesus, redeemer, redeemer of the world,
give us your peace, give us your peace.

The Giving of Communion

The table of bread and wine is now ready. It is the table of company with Jesus. and all who love him. It is the table of sharing with the poor of the world, with whom Jesus identified himself. It is the table of communion with the earth. in which Christ became incarnate. So come to this table. you who have much faith and you who would like to have more; you who have been here often and you who have not been for a while; you who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed; Come. It is Christ who invites us to meet him here.

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

All: Thanks be to God.

Please follow the directions of the sidespeople as the congregation is invited to come forward to receive the bread and wine.

If you would prefer not to receive communion, please come forward for a blessing. Crossing your hands over your chest will signal the priest to give you a blessing instead.

Please stand for the lighting of the candles. The flame from the Christ Candle of the Advent wreath will light the tapers and then all the other candles in the church will be lit. When all the candles have been lit, the church will be darkened and we will say the Prayer after Communion.

Priest: Carry the light of God's love and blessings to friends and neighbours, to the lonely and lost, and to all who need our care and love.

All: We will let our lights shine before others.

Priest: Go out from this place knowing that God's gifts

are for sharing with all God's people.

All: We will show our thanks in giving.

We will show our love in caring.
