Dear faithful friends in Christ,
Happy New Year! **A LOOK AHEAD with Anticipation:** St. Mark's is adding **two new opportunities in January**, in addition to the "regular" ongoing ministries we share as we love God and love neighbor as ourselves.

1) **Wednesday nights. 5:30pm dinner and 6:00pm Worship. Both dinner and worship take place in the Family Life Center (FLC).** Come for one or both! A mid-week re-centering our lives on Christ and with one another is important.

2) **Because some children don't have loving parents and others can't live safely in their countries, Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) has been a light in the darkness for over 40 years.** Since 1976, LSC has been working to protect children from abuse and exploitation, help adults with disabilities to live as independently as possible, and to welcome immigrants and vetted refugees fleeing war or persecution seeking a new life. Each day LSC is guided by its mission statement, *"Empowered by Christ, we walk together with all we serve."* **Over the next five weeks, we will learn more about the Be The Light campaign.**

— Columbarium and Memorial Garden Update —

Since the update on the Columbarium reservations during the congregation meeting in November, we have received a couple more reservations. We also have investigated a different style columbarium and have identified a site that better integrates the garden into our campus life to improve access.



The new location will be in the grassy area between the curb and woods as you go from the main parking lot down to the Preschool entrance area. There is currently a bed there that contains azaleas that were part of garden planted in honor of Ruth Wagoner's service to our Preschool. The Columbarium and Memorial Garden will be incorporated into this area. The columbarium unit will be double-sided with 24 double niches on each side. It will be a lovely location with some nice landscaping and there is room for expansion as future needs arise.

The project will now proceed by working with Cavin-Cook for the purchase of the columbarium unit. It is expected that the installation will be completed by mid-2024.

NC Women of the ELCA also have several

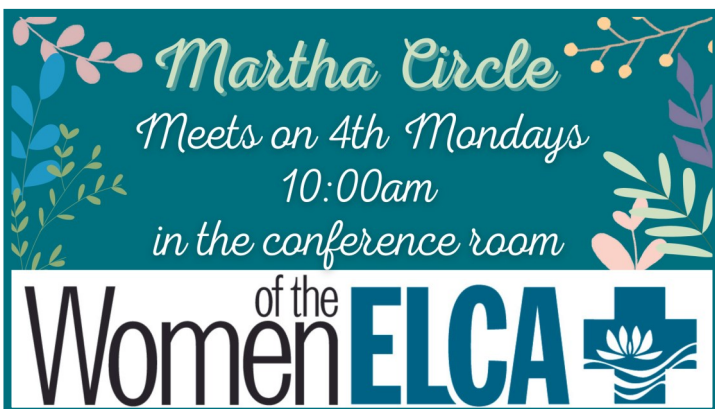
