Editor's note: Starting with the week of December 31, 2023, Take Five for Faith has transitioned from day-to-day short reflections to one themed reflection for the week exploring key Catholic concepts. We will miss the daily reflections, and we know you will too. But we are hopeful that you will find value in this in-depth approach to mining the riches of our faith.

JANUARY: Happy new year of grace to you and to all whom your ministry serves! We complete the Octave of Christmas as we open a fresh page of a new calendar. This month contains two solemnities: Mary Mother of God, which is also the World Day of Peace (1); as well as Epiphany, which is Orthodox Christmas as well as the traditional day for the Blessing of Homes (7). While visiting every parishioner's home may be impractical, supplying a short blessing for family members, doors, rooms, and significant furniture like the supper table is a way to remind all of us what a source of blessing the idea of home is for us.
January also contains two feasts: the Baptism of the Lord (8) and the Conversion of Saint Paul (25). In addition, we honor three U.S. saints this month: Mother Elizabeth Ann Seton (4), Bishop John Newman (5), and Mother Marianne Cope (23). The Third Sunday of Ordinary Time is the Sunday of the Word of God (21), followed by the Day for the Legal Protection of the Unborn (22). We observe Christian Unity Week (18-25) as we seek to heal division in the church, and Catholic Schools Week (28-Feb. 3) to prepare the church's future leaders.

Our nation honors civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Jr. (15) as the international community remembers the Holocaust (27). We pray this year, as always, for peace on Earth and good will toward all.

Preparation of the Gifts \pre-pə-'rā-shən | 'gifts $\backslash$

## CONTEXT

The Preparation of the Gifts allows time for the preparation of our hearts. Like the Magi bearing gifts and doing homage to Majesty, we bring our gifts and our praise to the Table.

God has first blessed us with the gift of creation. Humans take those gifts given, wheat and grapes, and, using our creativity, make bread and wine. Then, we bring those gifts we have received and labored over to present them at the Altar/Table that they might be transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Finally, we receive them back in Communion. The procession of the Gifts says, in essence, "Behold the gifts God has given us!" -Father Roc O'Connor, S.J.

## WHY IT MATTERS

We take great care preparing other festive tables for our most cherished gatherings. Could we do less for the table where the Real Presence of Christ will be made tangible for us?

From the General Instructions of the Roman Missal: The altar or Lord's table, which is the center of the whole Liturgy of the Eucharist,
is made ready. . . . The offerings are then brought forward. It is a praiseworthy practice for the bread and wine to be presented by the faithful (73).

## Is Epiphany about giving or getting gifts?

"We three kings of Orient are/ bearing gifts we traverse afar." Nowhere in the gospels does it claim there are three kings. They are magi, hereditary priests of the ancient Medes and Persians. At least the carol gets one thing right: this wise group does bear gifts. Gold symbolizes wealth and power. Frankincense, used in prayer, represents the divine Presence. Myrrh prepares bodies for burial. It's an ominous sign that would make a startling gift. . . . But they were appropriate honors for the King of the Universe, the Divine Son, and the crucified Lord.

We also bear Jesus gifts at every Eucharist: bread, wine, and our financial sacrifice. "Made by human hands," these gifts are transformed and returned to us as the Body and Blood of Christ, and then redistributed for those in need.

More gifts come to us by way of this shared Table. Grace pours out on the assembly. Grace forgives sin, and rescues us from every evil. This is one gift you don't want to put at the bottom of a closet.
