Minister's Message

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born.

They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

- Matthew 2:1-6

Siblings in Christ,

There is a lot of meaning packed into these few verses. Herod and the Jerusalem elite do not know that the Word of God in the Old Testament is about to be fulfilled anew in the birth of Jesus; the insights of learned foreigners must show them how to interpret the Scriptures in their time and place. Likewise, these magi can read the signs of the stars, but they need the assistance of Jewish scribes and Jewish scriptures to interpret their specifics. Finally, no human knowledge is sufficient on its own; divine revelation in the form of the star is necessary.

Part of our liturgy is the affirmation of faith: a statement of our faith in response to the revealed Word of God which is read and interpreted in worship. Typically our affirmation is in the form of a Creed: a historic statement from a specific time and place in the history of the Church. Some of these are older and make claims that no longer hold meaning for some of us. Other statements are very new.

I know that some of you have been uncomfortable with the older statements especially, and I thank you for your patience. My hope is that, just as the truth about Jesus is revealed by many sources in Matthew, each of us will discover our own truth about Jesus in conversation with truths from many different sources. I hope that the experience of hearing and saying words that you may not agree with will help you to reflect on why you disagree, and to shape your own statement of faith. I hope, also, to encourage reflection on what it means to make a *collective* statement, and how differences are negotiated.

In the new year, perhaps during Lent, I hope we can have some conversations about what the process has been like, and what practices might speak to our own collective, evolving perspectives on our faith.

As always, thank you for the opportunity to minister and journey alongside you.
