

ZOOM BOOK CLUB: HOST ISABEL SCHECHTER





DID YOU KNOW?



From December 10, 1898 (the date of the annexation of Puerto Rico by the United States) up until 1952, it was considered a *felony to display the Puerto Rican flag* in public; the only flag permitted to be flown on the island was the flag of the United States. The flag was perceived as a symbol of rebellion and radicalism.

During this time, thousands of Puerto Ricans were detained, 3,000 Puerto Ricans were arrested within a week in November 1950. You would be fined \$10,000 for owning or even waving the Puerto Rican flag.

The flag of Puerto Rico was designed in 1895 to promote the ideal of Puerto Rican independence from Spain. It consists of five alternate red and white horizontal stripes with a single white five-pointed star resting in a blue triangle.

The three red strips symbolized the blood from the brave warriors, the two white stripes victory and peace after obtaining independence, the (original) blue represents the sky and sea with the white star being the island.




