After living through a bout of gallstones that resulted in gallbladder removal surgery last August, I have had to acknowledge that my body has changed. I want to build some bodily strength and stamina back up so I can do all the things I did before. To that end, I've been swimming 2-3 times a week and have started strength training with a friend at the Y on a weekly basis. It takes a lot of work and intentionality to strengthen and shape our bodies to function well in the world. And it takes patience. The work of rebuilding takes time.

The author of the letter to the Ephesians uses the language of the human body to talk about growth in the Christian community. Christ is the head, who directs everything the body does. Each individual member of the community is like a part of the body, and is joined and knit together with the other members. Working properly together promotes our growth as a body of believers.

After living through a pandemic, the body of our community has changed, but we continue to be strong and vibrant in many ways. Have you noticed that we have new people worshipping with us most weeks? Did you know that most of our new 2024 council leaders have never served on our council before? Have you gotten to know Em or engaged with the new prayer partner program with our youth that was introduced last month? Have you heard about the new intern, Emma Janzen, who we'll welcome later this month? Have you gotten to participate in any of the new ministries that have formed in recent years, such as the Justice and Diversity Team and the Congregational Care team?

All of this growth is strengthening and shaping the body of our congregation to follow Jesus and share the good news of God's saving love in the world. It takes time. It takes patience. But most of all, it takes all of us growing together. Thank you for being part of Christ's body with us!

Local and World Wide Helping -

The beginning of the year is also a time to remember Social Concerns needs for the rest of 2024. We have 200 backpacks to make. Quilts are being made twice a month and as you can see on the chart on page 8, they are being sent all over the world. Council and Committees

2024 Budget

Much of the January meeting was spent on discussing and voting on the proposed 2024 budget to present to the congregation. We ended 2023 with a considerable overage and also voted on distribution of those funds in 2024. Both of these reports were presented at the first Budget Hearing on January 14. The second Budget Hearing is scheduled for 9:15 on January 21. Heartfelt thanks to the Finance Committee for all their hard work putting the budget figures together.

Nominating Committee

Dennis Stalker, chair of the Nominating Committee, joined the council to bring everyone up to date on the progress of the Nominating Committee. At the time of our meeting we still needed two more people to run for council. Council members suggested some names for the committee to consider. Subsequent to the council meeting, the committee identified another candidate for a three-year term. We have all our nominees for 2024

December Statistical Report

Every month the council reviews the monthly statistical report. This report shows members who have joined our congregation, those who have left for whatever reason and attendance trends. In December it was noted that Bishop Satterlee, his wife and daughter are now members of Prince of Peace. Pastor explained that the Bishop has to have a home church, whether or not they attend regularly. As they live in Lansing and have many responsibilities around the Synod on Sundays, regular attendance is highly unlikely.

Constitution Update:

Lisa Creed and a small committee have been reviewing our constitution and working on rewording some sections for clarification. Lisa shared the updates with Pastor Dennis Smith from the Synod office. He provided some beneficial feedback to the committee. However, there have also been changes to the model constitution that we should include. When approved by council and the Synod, the constitution updates will be presented to the congregation for an official vote.

Intern Update:

Pastor reported that as soon as we secure housing, we are ready to invite Emma Janzen to Prince of Peace. Dave Reinhold and Lisa Creed have been reviewing housing options. *See below for a note from Emma!*
