A Message from Bishop Clara...

Wasn't that a celebration? I stood in the Cathedral Hall just before the consecration service taking it all in. The flurry of activity, excitement and energy was palpable. The procession line kept growing as it wrapped around the entire hall. I then stood outside waiting to begin our walk into the Cathedral; a taxi pulled up and a clergy from Vancouver jumped out hurrying to get inside. It was one of my former professors from VST who had travelled by bus to get here. I entered the nave of the Cathedral watching the congregation moving to the beat of the drums as if with one heartbeat. The Spirit was clearly moving in that place!

Friends, it was an amazing experience, and one that I will continue to reflect on as I take on the role as bishop and pastor to the good people of the Territory. I was particularly grateful to the Pastoral Elders for their willingness to teach and lead us at various points in the service. It reminded me of how important our work of healing and reconciliation continues to be.

We could not have accomplished what we did without the incredible dedication and abilities of our Territory staff, Claire Tosoff and Dean Kyle Norman. I want to thank all the clergy and laity who attended the service, everyone at the Cathedral, musicians, singers, reception/hospitality team, photographer, livestream team, altar guild, greeters, and the list goes on!

The consecration was not just an event for the bishop, it was an opportunity for us to come together to celebrate, affirm and seek God's blessing as we began a new chapter. Now it is time to pause and listen deeply to what the Spirit is inviting us into.

We will soon begin the season of Lent, a time of prayer and reflection, taking stock of our own spiritual journeys and life together. We will begin a Territory Lenten study called "Practicing Forgiveness with all our Heart, Soul, Strength, and Mind". It will be offered on Zoom on Tuesdays at 4 pm starting Feb 20th for six weeks. 
