

You are welcome to participate in smudging as you enter the church to worship. Smudging is a sign of purification and peace offered to anyone who would like to participate. When the weather is too difficult to offer smudging outdoors – and at any time that you are in the church building, dry smudge is available. The sacred medicines – tobacco, sage, sweetgrass, and cedar – are provided at the side chapel. Rub the medicines in your hands and place them in the shell bowl; after use these will be respectfully burned. St John's is grateful to Indigenous members of our community for offering smudging.

THE FIRST READING Isaiah 40:21-31

Have you not known? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and spreads them like a tent to live in; who brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing. Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble. To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One.

Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing. Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God"? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Ne savez-vous pas, n'avez-vous pas entendu, ne vous a-t-il pas été annoncé dès l'origine, n'avez-vous pas discerné le fondateur de la terre? Il habite, lui, sur le dôme couvrant la terre dont les habitants font figure de sauterelles! Il a tendu les cieux comme un rideau, il les a déployés comme une tente pour y habiter. Il réduit à rien les chefs d'Etat, les juges de la terre, il en fait une nullité; oui, peu importe qu'ils soient implantés; oui, peu importe qu'ils se soient disséminés; oui, peu importe que leur souche soit enracinée dans la terre! Même alors, s'il souffle sur eux, les voilà qui sèchent et le tourbillon les enlève comme de la paille. A qui m'assimilerez-vous? A qui serai-je identique? dit le Saint. Levez bien haut vos yeux et voyez: qui a créé ces êtres? – Celui qui mobilise au complet leur armée et qui les convoque tous par leur nom.

Si amples sont ses forces, si ferme son énergie, que pas un n'est porté manquant! Jacob, pourquoi dis-tu, Israël, pourquoi affirmes-tu: Mon chemin est caché au SEIGNEUR, mon droit échappe à mon Dieu. » Ne sais-tu pas, n'as-tu pas entendu? Le SEIGNEUR est le Dieu de toujours, il crée les extrémités de la terre. Il ne faiblit pas, il ne se fatique pas; nul moyen de sonder son intelligence, il donne de l'énergie au faible il amplifie l'endurance de qui est sans forces. Ils faiblissent, les jeunes, ils se fatiquent, même les hommes d'élite trébuchent bel et bien! Mais ceux qui espèrent dans le SEIGNEUR retrempent leur énergie : ils prennent de l'envergure comme des aigles, ils s'élancent et ne se fatiquent pas, ils avancent et ne faiblissent pas!

PSALM 147:1-12, 21c



Hallelujah! How good it is to sing praises to our God! How pleasant it is to honor him with praise! The Lord rebuilds Jerusalem; he gathers the exiles of Israel.

He heals the broken-hearted and binds up their wounds. He counts the number of the stars and calls them all by their names.

Great is our Lord and mighty in power; there is no limit to his wisdom.

The Lord lifts up the lowly, but casts the wicked to the ground.

Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving; make music to our God upon the harp.

He covers the heavens with clouds and prepares rain for the earth; He makes grass to grow upon the mountains and green plants to serve mankind.

THE SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 9:16-23

If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel. For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command,


we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;
