

Love that rose for us.


Love that still forgives and knows us.

CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

For today's prayer of confession, we will pray with our whole selves—mind, body, heart, and soul—through a kinesthetic prayer. I invite you to listen and follow along by actively responding to the prompts I give you as you are able. Let us begin with open eyes and an open heart as I guide you through this time of prayer.

Let us pray:

Jesus of Nazareth walked this earth seeing and giving to those in need —the Samaritan woman, the child, the blind man, the Pharisee—yet too often we close our eyes, allowing fear or prejudice to hold us back. If you have ever ignored someone who was in need, please close your eyes.

Jesus modeled a life of grace, whispering from the cross, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Even with his example, we struggle to live lives of grace, often speaking words of hostility and shame over forgiveness or patience. If you have ever dealt harshly with someone, embracing hostility instead of peace, or shame instead of grace, please clench your fists.

Jesus gave thanks before breaking bread, modeling a life of gratitude before consumption. However, we easily find ourselves in entitled mindsets and habits, taking this earth and God's creation for granted, consuming before caring. If you have ever chosen consumption without gratitude, or comfort over care, Please cross your arms.

Jesus said from the cross, "Behold your son; behold your mother." It was a remind-

er that we belong together, as all of us are made in God's good image. However, too often we forget that we are worthy of belonging, denying God's image in ourselves or others. If you have ever been ashamed of who you are, or have denied the divine image in another, bow your head.

Friends, this is what sin feels like—being cut off from others, closed off from the world, left in the dark, alone and disconnected from God. However, God knows us and loves us. Like a mother with her children, God will not abandon us!

Thus, if you have ever seen someone in need and responded with care, open your eyes.

If you have ever seen God in another, or trusted God's promise that you are worthy of love, lift your head.

If you have ever chosen forgiveness and grace over hatred and hostility, unclench your fists.

And if you have ever chosen gratitude over entitlement, or willingly made a sacrifice for the care of God's creation, uncross your arms now.


Remember this day, God's grace is for all of us no matter who we are or what we've done or left undone. FIRST READING

Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

¹When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. ²And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." ³Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, ⁴"As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. ⁵No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. ⁶I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. ⁷I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your off-spring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you."

¹⁵God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sa-

rah shall be her name. ¹⁶I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her."

SECOND READING

Romans 4:13-25


¹³The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

¹⁶For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." ¹⁹He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. 22Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." ²³Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, ²⁴but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

³⁴He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."


