On PIE Day, let's have some PIE and watch a movie! Celebrate our Affirming church on Wed March 13th at 7⁰⁰ pm



PIE Day, also known as National Affirming Day, is a day to celebrate our status as the only Affirming church on Vancouver Island north of Parksville! "PIE" stands for Public, Intentional, Explicit Inclusion of 2SLGBTQIA+ People . Every year, we celebrate PIE Day on or near March 14th. (March 14 = 3.14 = π = pi = PIE, right?) This year, we are going to celebrate PIE Day on **Wed Mar 13th at 7^{oo} p.m.** with lots of

pie and a screening of the movie *Love Free or Die.*, which tells the story of Gene Robinson, the first openly gay person to become a Episcopalian (Anglican) bishop. His consecration by the Diocese of New Hampshire in 2003 (to which he wore a bullet-proof vest) caused an international stir. The movie won a special jury award at the 2012 Sundance Film Festival.

Even better, we will start the movie screening with a Zoom session with Gene Robinson himself!

Lent 2024: The Blessing Hour Connect with your beloved queerness in a spiritual way!

We are joining hands with Weird Church in Cumberland to launch a Lenten project called **The Blessing Hour**. Too often church spaces and communities have been not only unwelcoming but also unsafe, even hostile environments for those in the 2SLGBTQIA+ population, which is a violation of that Love.

SAGE sez: Support a Canadian environmental justice law Join us in calling on the Senate to pass Bill C-226

SAGE (Sustainability Action Group for the Environment), our environmental action team, is calling on us to take action: Environmental racism occurs when environmental policies or practices intentionally or unintentionally result in disproportionate negative impacts on Indigenous and racialized individuals, groups or communities. Too often, Canadian environmental law and policy fail to prevent this from occurring. It's a gap that must be addressed with clear legislative



requirements and accountability mechanisms. The **National Strategy Respecting Environmental Racism and Environmental Justice Act** would require the federal government to establish a national strategy to assess, prevent and address environmental racism and advance environmental justice. The House of Commons passed Bill C-226 in March 2023, but the Senate still needs to approve it before it becomes law.

We're promoting a petition in collaboration with the Canadian Association of Physicians for the Environment, West Coast Environmental Law and other partners. We'll submit it to the Senate standing committee on energy, the environment and natural resources, Sen. Mary Jane McCallum (the bill's sponsor) and other senators.

Did you know...?



This Thursday, February 29th is a Leap Day, added to the end of February once every four years to bring our calendar back into line with the solar year of solstices and equinoxes. But did you know that in 55 BCE when Julius Caesar introduced the concept of a leap year every fourth year, the extra day wasn't placed at the end of February but after February 24th — and the leap day was also called February 24th! Yes, both days were dated February 24th and legally they counted as a single day! This odd practice of not counting the leap day as an extra day continued for the next 1500 years.
