Candle lighting

ONE: We continue our journey through the season of lent. We journey with Jesus through the wilderness, from town to town to temple, all the way to Jerusalem. Along the way we are invited to let go of what we no longer need, and gather a sense of who we are, and whose we are. As we gather here today, let's draw our attention to our spiritual and social longing. Notice all that inspires you in a day, and how this saturates your being. Recall those you have been connected to already today: Those you've cared for, had conversations with, even those who crossed your path in a fleeting way: Sharing a stop light, or listening to the same program on the radio, anonymously united in thought and feeling. Notice where you are fulfilled and encouraged, and notice where you are overwhelmed and fatigued. In all of this, remember who you are.

ALL: We are blessed, and we are blessing. We are loved, and we are loving. We are called to rest in God's grace, and from here, live in to a world of compassion and peace.

ONE: In scripture we hear that on Mount Sinai, God gave Moses the law: A guide for the Hebrew people and a covenant between them.

ALL: And also to you. ONE: *Lift your hearts*

ALL: We lift them up to God.

ONE: Let us give thanks to the God we love. **ALL:** We freely give God thanks and praise.

ONE: It is well and good, beautiful and holy that we should, among joy's ebbs and flow give our thanks and praise to you, Holy and merciful God, Through Jesus Christ, our teacher.

And so, in grateful procession of endless praise With the church that is, was and shall be in years to come We proclaim glory:

ALL: Holy, Holy Holy, loving God almighty.
