

On PIE Day, let's have some PIE and watch a movie! Celebrate our Affirming church on Wed March 13th at 7^{oo} pm

PIE Day, also known as National Affirming Day, is a day to celebrate our status as the only Affirming church on Vancouver Island north of Parksville!

"PIE" stands for Public, Intentional, Explicit Inclusion of 2SLGBTQIA+ People . Every year, we celebrate PIE Day on or near March 14th. (March 14 = 3.14 = π = pi = PIE, right?)

This year, we are going to celebrate PIE Day on **Wed Mar 13**th **at 7**^{oo} **p.m.** with lots of pie and a screening of the movie *Love Free or Die*, which tells the story of Gene Robinson on his journey through seminary, marriage, fatherhood and the discovery that he is gay. He was ultimately elected as the first publicly gay Bishop in Christendom.

Even better, Bishop Robinson will be joining us by Zoom to introduce the film and its context and then will rejoin us at the film's end to participate in a Q&A and conversation about sexual and gender identity in the church and the wider community.

Beach Street Players finishes another successful season





"Love Resists: Nonviolence & Sacred Activism" 4-week On-Line Workshop in April about 2SLGBTQIA+ rights

Rev Karen has highlighted "Love Resists: Nonviolence & Sacred Activism", an on-line workshop that will explore nonviolence and sacred activism for 2SLGBTQIA+ rights over four Thursday evenings in April. This workshop welcomes those who are Allies, accomplices, and 2SLGBTQIA+ people who are new(ish) to taking action or looking to deepen your soulfulness as you show up yet again. This course will offer tools, ideas, and practices to help you as you work to publicly affirm and protect the beloved community.

Co-facilitated by renowned activists and trainers Rev. Dr. Jerry Maynard and Rivera Sun, these four 90-minute sessions



will cover living resistance and movement history (both general and 2SLGBTQIA+), strategies for making change, an introduction to nonviolence as a transformative power, the spiritual strength — from any tradition — that can support us, and much more.

Using stories, examples, exercises, videos, discussion, and sharing, this series will help you feel more confident in showing up at protests, give you tools for staying safe and taking reasonable risks in pursuit of change, and offer countless real life examples to give us all courage.

Congrats to Coldest Night of the Year team Still not too late to donate!



Last Saturday, the "Comox United Walkers", a team of 20 led by Marj Adams, participated in the Coldest Night of the Year walk. This year, it didn't snow like last year or pour rain like the previous year. In fact it was a beautiful night for a walk! The team raised \$4665, which will go to the local organizations "Dawn to Dawn Action on Homelessness Society", which makes transitional housing possible in the Comox Valley; and the Comox Valley Transition Society, which supports women, children and families who are experiencing or fleeing abuse.

Coldest Night of the Year fell just short of their overall goal of \$200,000 this year, but it's not too late — Comox United Walkers are still accepting donations until the end of March. You will receive a Tax receipt for donations of \$20 or more. All the money raised stays right here in our Valley!! See Marj Adams for details!
