"Jesus in our Disability(s)"

2 Corinthians 12:1-10

Opening Questions – Choose one.

- Has your perception of disability(s) changed over the years? Why or why not?
- How do you react when a person shares spiritual experiences that seem completely beyond your reach?

Discussion Questions

- 1. **Read 2 Corinthians 12:1-10.** So far, how had Paul authenticated his apostleship (see 11²¹⁻³⁰; 6³⁻¹⁰)?
 - How would this sound if you read it on a pastor's resume?
- 2. Paul describes his experience of being caught up to paradise by referring to "a man in Christ" (vv.1-6). Why do you think he refrains from boasting about such an exalted experience (cf. 4⁵⁻⁷; 10¹²⁻¹⁸)?
 - On what basis does Paul believe he should be evaluated by the Corinthians (v.6)?
- 3. Opinions concerning Paul's "thorn in my flesh" (v.7) range widely. While no conclusive answer can be given about the details, what do we know about this "thorn" that Paul faced?
- 4. How do you react when God appears to be silent in answer to your heartfelt and repeated prayers?
- 5. What was accomplished by Paul's repeated prayer to God for the removal of his thorn?
- 6. In contrast to Paul's ecstatic experiences, the simple answer to his prayer (v.9) is a revelation that deeply impacted not only him but countless others through the ages. What was unexpected about the answer he received? What effect did this answer have on Paul?
- 7. In what ways does the apostle Paul's experience with his "thorn in the flesh" challenge common perceptions of success and credibility, both in his time and today?
- 8. Discuss any personal experiences or insights you have regarding finding strength and purpose in the midst of suffering or limitations.
- 9. What impact did the video testimonial of Philip & Robyn Serez have on others? On you?
- 10. How can our church community better support individuals experiencing chronic illness, disability, or mental health struggles? What practical steps can be taken to offer meaningful support and encouragement?
