PROGRESS ALONG THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD

The men received texts from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) notifying them that their applications have been received, their fingerprints are on file, fees have been waived, and additional paperwork must be submitted.

One man passed his Behind-the-Wheel DMV road test on March 22nd! This changes a lot for the Afghans, and for the Team. They will now be able to transport themselves to appointments, work, ELL classes, the bank, etc. This will provide much more independence and brings them that much closer to assimilation. The second man will have his Behind-the-Wheel DMV road test in April. Team members (and, spouses) have spent hours helping the men practice driving to ready them for their road tests.

The continuing support from the members of SMLC has been crucial in providing the services needed for the men. From English books to learn the language, to bus tokens to teach the men how to get around Kenosha, to driving school for Behind-the-Wheel lessons, to auto insurance to actually get the men on the road, SMLC members have shared their resources to help the Afghans. This commitment from members of our congregation has helped defray costs that would have been challenging for the men to cover on their own. The Holy Spirit continues to work in, with, and through SMLC to provide clothing, food, shelter, and safety to those in our community, our nation, and our world.
