Resurrection Greetings!

As we draw nearer to the holiest day in the Christian calendar, the resurrection of Christ, I encourage you to think of someone to invite to join you for worship.

While we live in a busy world, a significant thing we can do with our time is spend it in the presence of our Lord in worship. There is also something powerful about gathering together with people as well!

A recent survey said that the average Christian can identify seven unchurched people with whom they have a personal relationship. In a national study, 82% of the non-churched said they would try a church with a friend or relative if invited.

Statistics show that those who come to church for the first time do so in the following ways:

- 6-8% Walked in by own initiative
- 2-3% Liked a program or ministry
- 8-10% Liked the pastor
- 3-4% Had a need met by the church.
- 1-2% Were evangelized
- 70-85% Invited by a relative or friend!

That means an average of 83% came to church because of an INVITE by a congregation member.

While there are many ways to invite someone to church to hear the unconditional love of Christ, and to experience the hospitality and welcoming spirit we have, the first thing we must do is make up our mind to ask and then, much like Philip said to Nathaniel, say, "Come and see"! (JOHN 1:46)

Here at Kapa'a United Church of Christ, like most Christian Churches, we try to make Easter Sunday, an incredible celebration for all gathered. This is also an excellent time to introduce others to the resurrection's lifegiving story! But, as important as Easter is in our Christian lives, we also want people to recognize the church even "after" the big day! Besides, as believers in Christ and his resurrection, we live with the resurrection in our hearts and minds every day and every time we gather to worship!

Can you think of one person you will invite for Easter Sunday? Why not pray that God will prepare their hearts to hear your invitation?

You could be the difference in someone's life whether they know Christ as their Savior and whether they have an amazing, welcoming church to call home.

Hope to see you and your friends and family on Easter Sunday this year! "Come and see."

I think that is what happens at the food pantry every Sunday. We do the work because we want to share God's love and as a result, we enjoy the camaraderie of the company we are in and the people who we serve. And slowly by slowly (in our old age, mind you) we know many by first name and are able to engage and share hospitality. The other week, I overheard Naomi Hamamura who volunteered as a "shopper" for the first time (assisting individuals as they shop for food) say "this is really fun!" Because quite truthfully, it is a lot of fun---more than I imagined possible when we agreed to embark on this outreach project! 




