All	Blessed be God for ever.

This opening prayer may be said

Leader The night has passed, and the day lies open before us; let us pray with one heart and mind.

Silence is kept.

As we rejoice in the gift of this new day,		
so may the light of your presence, O God,		
set our hearts on fire with love for you;		
now and for ever.

The Word of God *Psalmody*

The appointed psalm(s) is said. Each psalm or group of psalms may end with

All Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.

Scripture Reading

An appointed Reading from the Scriptures is read. After a period of silent reflection the following is said.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

Gospel Canticle

The Benedictus (The Song of Zechariah) is normally said

All	The Word of God, begotten of the Father before time began,
	humbled himself for us and was incarnate
	from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary. Alleluia.

- Blessed be the Lord the God of Israel,
 who has come to his people and set them free.
- 2 He has raised up for us a mighty Saviour, born of the house of his servant David.
- 3 Through his holy prophets God promised of old to save us from our enemies, from the hands of all that hate us,
- 5 This was the oath God swore to our father Abraham: to set us free from the hands of our enemies,

6	Free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.
7	And you, child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, • for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way,
8	To give his people knowledge of salvation * by the forgiveness of all their sins.
9	In the tender compassion of our God 🔸 the dawn from on high shall break upon us,
10	To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, • and to guide our feet into the way of peace. <i>Luke 1.68-79</i>
All	Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.
