# Minister's Message

Early in the morning on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb.

- John 20:1-3

### Siblings in Christ,

There is a risk, when interpreting the Bible, of getting caught up on insignificant details and thus missing the forest for the trees. Nevertheless, I am puzzled by that little word, "we."

We do not know where they have laid him? Who is this "we," given that Mary is alone? Is this a mistake by John, or one of the earliest copyists, subconsciously reading in details from the other Gospel versions in which Mary is accompanied by other women? Or, given that every sentence in John tends to be carefully crafted and loaded with symbolic and theological meaning, should we make more of it?

Later, in verse thirteen, Mary says to the angels in the tomb, "They have taken away my Lord, and *I* do not know where they have laid him." Over the intervening eleven verses, Mary's puzzlement moves from the collective to the individual. In this time, Peter and the other disciple have come to the tomb and seen for themselves. The other disciple, but not Peter, "believes."

Is Mary therefore speaking on behalf of the community in verse two, but speaking for herself in verse thirteen, given that the others have begun to draw their own conclusions? Do we, also, not know what has become of Jesus at that point in the story? In our Lectio Divina session this past Wednesday, we wondered

about the role of the angels. Why does Mary see them, whereas others do not? Trudy suggested that perhaps Mary needs to see them – more must be revealed to Mary – because she will be commissioned to interpret for the others what has happened. All of us are confronted with the mystery of the resurrection. All of us will draw our own conclusions and have our own experience of the resurrection, but then we are all called to share the truths we have discerned with the gathered community of disciples. Individually we may indeed not know what has become of Jesus, but together, while we may not resolve the mystery into one unitary understanding, we deepen and enter into the mystery so that, like a prism, its many facets may enrich our lives and our spirits with many kinds of beauty. Let go and tell our siblings what we have heard, that they also may hear the good news.
