Eastertide - A cheat sheet for the next 50 days

Following the 40 days of Lent, we joyously celebrated Easter Sunday on March 31 this year. Easter Sunday is the first day in the Easter Season, aka Eastertide. The Easter Season lasts 40 days taking us to the Ascension, plus another 10 days taking us to Pentacost. In our church, we celebrate all 50 days as Eastertide.

- Eastertide 2024: 50 days from Easter Sunday through Pentacost March 31 through May 19
- Ascension Day 2024: 40 days after Easter Sunday through Thursday, May 9
- Pentacost 2024: The Seventh Sunday after Easter May 19

During Eastertide, we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus. There are 7 Sundays after Easter Sunday in Eastertide, and each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter. You will notice Pastor Joanne wearing a white stole on these Sundays.

We celebrate Easter Sunday as the day that Jesus was resurrected from the grave. For the next 40 days, Jesus periodically appeared to his disciples, sometimes in human form and sometimes in spirit form. He spent this time preparing his disciples for Ascension Day and the Feast of Pentacost.

Ascension Day is the day that Jesus rose to Heaven to be with God. While we don't have a church service on this day, it might be considered the most important day on the Christian calendar.

Pentacost is the day that the people were windswept by the Holy Spirit, Jesus's advocate. Red is the traditional color of Pentacost.

Follow along this season as Pastor Joanne takes us through Eastertide 2024.

Fellowship Hour generally follows the worship service.
Please join us after the service, downstairs in the Social Room.
It is a favorite Sunday ritual and gives visitors, friends and members of the congregation a chance to socialize over delicious foods, a nice cuppa, and some fun activities.



Shopping Cart Ministry April Most Needed Items

Cornerstone is requesting:

- Boxes of dry pasta
- Peanut butter
- Boxes of macaroni and cheese
- Spaghetti sauce in plastic jars (such as Francesco Rinaldi) or cans
- Cans of condensed soup (especially chicken noodle and tomato)
- Pouches of instant potatoes
- Canned pasta
- Rice side dishes (such as Rice-A-Roni, Knorr side dishes)

Lee Hayward, the Director of Cornerstone Food Pantry, would like us to know that the number of families seeking food assistance from the Cupboard continues to grow by 25-30 each month, which means we need more nonperishable food items each month.

You will probably note that certain items you expected us to seek are not on the list, e.g., canned vegetables, canned beans. That is because we are able to obtain such items for free or at a very reduced cost at Connecticut Foodshare.

Any support you can provide to us will make a difference in helping so many families struggling in this economy.
