

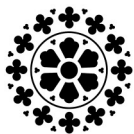

### The Nicene Creed

he became the perfect and sufficient sacrifice  
for the sins of the whole world.  
Redeemed by Christ,  
we have been adopted as your children;  
by your pardon  
you have made us worthy to praise you.

On the night he was betrayed,  
Jesus, at supper with his friends,  
took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread,  
gave it to them, and said, "Take and eat:  
this is my body which is given for you.  
Do this for the remembrance of me."  
After supper he took the cup of wine,  
and when he had given thanks,  
he gave it to them,  
and said, "Drink this all of you:

this is my blood of the new covenant  
which is shed for you and for all  
for the forgiveness of sins.  
Whenever you drink it,  
do this for the remembrance of me.”

In obedience to him and with grateful hearts  
we approach your holy table,  
remembering our Saviour’s sacrifice,  
and rejoicing in his victory.  
Confident in his sovereign purpose,  
we declare our faith.

*All*        **Christ has died,  
Christ is risen,  
Christ will come again.**

*Presider*    Send your Holy Spirit on us  
that as we receive this bread and this cup  
we may partake of the body and blood  
of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
and feed on him in our hearts  
by faith with thanksgiving.

May we be renewed in his risen life,  
filled with love,  
and strengthened in our will to serve others;  
and make of our lives, we pray,  
a pure and holy sacrifice, acceptable to you,  
knitting us together as one in your Son Jesus Christ,  
to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit,  
be all honour and glory, now and forever.

## **Archbishop Linda Nicholls to Visit the Diocese**

Archbishop Linda Nicholls, Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, will be visiting the Diocese April 19-24, 2024. In her time as Primate she has travelled extensively both across Canada and across the communion and brings an important perspective on Anglicanism in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. All are invited to hear Archbishop Linda preach at Choral Evensong at 4pm next Sunday, 21 April.

## **Monthly Outreach - Sleeping Children Around the World**

April's Monthly Outreach recipient is Sleeping Children around the World (SCAW). This is a Canadian charity that distributes bedkits to children ages 6-12 in some of the most disadvantaged parts of the world. A bedkit consists of mosquito netting, a mattress, two sets of clothes, school supplies and whatever else the local partner thinks is important-all for \$40 Cdn. Every penny of each donation goes to the bedkit. None of any donation pays for administrative costs. Importantly, all items in the bedkit are sourced locally so there are no transportation costs and the money goes into the local economy. By the time you read this, one of the Cathedral's parishioners will be in Uganda helping to distribute 8000 bedkits.
