

VESPERS on the Lesser Feast of Sor Juana Ines de la Cruz 1695 (Sister Joan Agnes of the Cross)

The Preparation

Presider

Juana Ines de Asbaje y Ramirez de Santillana was born 12 November 1648 near Mexico City. She reportedly learned to read and write by age three, do accounting by age five, compose religious poetry by age eight, teach Latin by age thirteen, and master Greek logic by adolescence. Denied university studies because she was a woman, she defended her knowledge and skill before a tribunal of theologians, philosophers, and justices at age seventeen before entering a monastery of Carmelite nuns.

The rigid Carmelite discipline did not allow her genius to bloom, so she moved to the more relaxed Order of St. Jerome in 1667, taking the religious name Sor Juana Ines de la Cruz (Sister Joan Agnes of the Cross, in English). Her blossoming literary career drew both admiration and ire from both the ecclesiastical and secular societies. In the midst of a very public intellectual career, she managed to balance religious devotion and life in community. She gave in to threats of official ecclesiastical censure, and stopped publishing her writing by 1693. She died in 1695 while serving her religious community during an outbreak of the plague.

Reading Matthew 5: 17-20

Reader

Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
