Blankets arranged on the floor represent land and participants are invited to step into the roles of **First Nations**, **Inuit** and later **Métis** peoples. The workshop helps us understand how the **colonization** of this land impacts those who were here long before settlers arrived. It engages our **minds** and **hearts** in understanding why the relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples is often broken and how we can take action **together**.

The Exercise takes from 60 to 90 minutes and will be followed by a **Sharing Circle** and **Feast**. The occasion is part of our commitment to build **relationships** with our Aboriginal relations based on a growing understanding of our shared history.

The Blanket Exercise will take place at **St. James' Anglican Church** Basement, 230 Gore St. South, Vancouver, unceded Coast Salish traditional territory.
