There is often talk about what Jesus did for us. And also quite a bit said about what Jesus calls us to. But how often do we hear about the promises Jesus made to us? Join us this weekend as we take a look at some of those promises and what they might hold for our lives today!

Scripture:

Acts 1:6-8

So when the apostles were with Jesus, they kept asking him, “Lord, has the time come for you to free Israel and restore our kingdom?” ⁷ He replied, “The Father alone has the authority to set those dates and times, and they are not for you to know. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

Matthew 28:16-20 NLT

Then the eleven disciples left for Galilee, going to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him—but some of them doubted! ¹⁸ Jesus came and told his disciples, “I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. ²⁰ Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age.”

Questions:

- What do you think about promises that have been made to you? Do you trust them? If so, what makes you trust? If not, what makes you distrustful?
- Think about the promises of Jesus talked about today. What promises do you readily accept? What promises make you uncomfortable? Do you doubt any of them? Are there any you wish weren't made?
- Choose one of Jesus' promises to focus on this week – start by writing it down. Look at it every day. Think about it. What difference does it make in your life today? Embrace the truth of the promise and see what happens!
