After a time for contemplation and engagement with the stations, a chime or tone is sounded to regather the community around the altar.

Presider You are invited to join in an affirmation of faith.

All **You, O God, are Creator of all, by whom every being in heaven and earth is fashioned, named, and sustained. You call us each by name.
You, O God, are Living Word, who came and pitched your tent with us, lived and died and rose again.**

You speak to us now through faith.

You, O God, are Holy Spirit, who comforts, strengthens, and inspires, sending us forth to share your love. You are the breath of grace.

**You, O God, are Trinity: Creator, Word, Spirit; artist, healer, friend.
You are holy mystery. We worship you. Amen.**

The Prayers

Presider Let us bring our prayers and our confessions to our God, remembering all who are in need this night, in body, mind, or spirit.

Silence is kept for prayer, confession, and reflection. During this time, a prayer jar is passed around the circle into which heart emblems and other offerings can be placed as signs of prayers. At the conclusion, the jar is placed on the altar.

Presider Let us pray. Holy One,

All **we long for you.**

You know our wounding and our broken-heartedness.

You know how others have hurt us, and how we have hurt others.

You alone have the healing we need.

Yours is the love that changes everything. Amen.

Giver of life, have mercy on us; pardon and deliver, revive and strengthen, and keep us in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Blessed is the One who comes in your name!
Hosanna in the highest to the one, true, loving God.**
