Acceptable donations are items you would sell at a sale at your home. Donations must be in good working condition, gently used & clean. We have been approved to participate in the FUNDrive with Savers and will also accept donations of clean and in sellable condition clothing, household textiles, shoes, handbags and books. If possible, please separate kids and adult clothing. Please do NOT donate items that require a disposal fee. For example – electronics or large furniture.

Donations can be dropped off NOW at the church on Fridays from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm or Sundays from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Please place your donations in the thrift sale storage room. Using the west entrance, go down the steps and first room on the right.

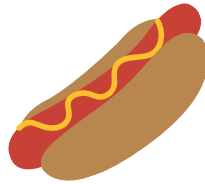
## SPRING THRIFT SALE CONT.
