A Message from Our Pastor The Rev. Dr. Jordan Miller-Stubbendick

As spring and Easter approach, I've been thinking about what it is that keeps us going through ordinary days, hard times, and joyful days alike. There are lots of answers to this question, of course. Some might include family, friends, pets, time in nature, faith, and so on. All of these things are important. But what about the power of small interactions and kindnesses to connect us to each other and brighten up the day?

I think small kindnesses are vastly underrated. They can change the course of a day or even a lifetime. They matter far more than we give them credit for. In celebration of the small kindnesses that give shape and color and delight to our days, I hope you enjoy Danusha Lameris's poem, Small Kindnesses.

I've been thinking about the way, when you walk down a crowded aisle, people pull in their legs to let you by. Or how strangers still say "bless you" when someone sneezes, a leftover from the Bubonic plague. "Don't die," we are saying. And sometimes, when you spill lemons from your grocery bag, someone else will help you pick them up. Mostly, we don't want to harm each other. We want to be handed our cup of coffee hot, and to say thank you to the person handing it. To smile at them and for them to smile back. For the waitress to call us honey when she sets down the bowl of clam chowder, and for the driver in the red pick-up truck to let us pass. We have so little of each other, now. So far from tribe and fire. Only these brief moments of exchange. What if they are the true dwelling of the holy, these fleeting temples we make together when we say, "Here, have my seat," "Go ahead—you first," "I like your hat."

Dear friends,

Caregiving can be stressful as well as rewarding. You might wonder if you are really a caregiver? Do you monitor someone's medical condition? Do you buy and organize medication for others? Do you talk with health care providers on behalf of a person? Do you provide hygiene and basic care assistance? Do you shop, cook, or provide meal management in any way? Are you managing a person's finances or making sure a household is up and running? If you said yes to any of the above...congratulations, you are a caregiver! So now that you have established your caregiving status, let me ask you a few more questions. Do you feel overwhelmed or constantly worried or tired all the time? Do you feel like you need more sleep, or are you getting too much sleep? Do you become easily irritated or angry? Are you losing interest in activities you used to enjoy? Are you feeling sad? Have you been having frequent headaches, bodily pain or other physical problems? Do you find yourself abusing alcohol or drugs, including prescription medications? If you answered yes to any of these questions you might be suffering from caregiver stress.

The Department of Aging and Disability in Kenosha can be a great resource for caregivers. They have an online resource book that directs you to available resources in the community.

2023 Community Service Directory. There is a family caregiver support group that you can join that meets the 1st Thursday of the month from 4-5 p.m. either virtual or in person, facilitated by Margaret Ricchio, Caregiver Support Specialist... call 262-605-6646 to learn more. Also, there are caregiver classes offered throughout the year for those interested in learning more about caregiving. A person can register for the "Powerful Tools for Caregivers", a six-week, workshop, that is a self-care education program for family

caregivers. PTC provides self-care tools and strategies to better handle the unique challenges caregivers face. Subjects include reducing personal stress, changing negative self-talk, communicating effectively in challenging situations, recognizing emotions and difficult feelings, and making tough caregiving decisions. Class size is limited, and registration is required. The deadline for registering is Thursday May 1. The class runs Thursdays, May 5th - June 12th, 2 to 3:30 p.m. Call 262-605-6646.

The Easter Vigil

Since ancient times, the church has traditionally held an Easter vigil service on the Saturday night before Easter Sunday morning. The sacred three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday reach their peak in the Easter Vigil service, which abounds in imagery evoking responses from deep within the human psyche: darkness/light, death/life, chaos/order, slavery/freedom. This most holy night celebrates the central mystery of salvation – Christ's saving death and mighty rising.

In the ancient church the Vigil was a watch through the night for signs of the rising dawn. During this night we pass over from death to renewed life with Christ as we light a new fire for the paschal candle.

The Vigil was the culmination of nearly two years of training for new Christians. It was during this service that they were baptized into the body of Christ and were also permitted to receive communion for the first time. All of the people would fast from Thursday on. They would gather at sunset and kindle a fire. Our service will also begin with fire, the service of light, announcing the dawn of Easter. The paschal candle will be re-lit.

The new Christians-in-training (catechumens) would then hear a series of readings (usually 12) that center around water, encompassing the whole of salvation history. Although our service will not have this many readings, we will hear some of these traditional readings, and be reminded that we have been washed and renewed as children of God in our baptism.

The third portion of the service centers around baptism and the affirmation of the baptismal covenant. While baptism is permanent and indelible and lasts forever, we need daily to return to that covenant through confession and forgiveness, and regularly to renew the faith we profess.

The Vigil concludes with the proclamation that "Christ is risen." And we respond, "Christ is risen, indeed!" We celebrate this great good news—namely that Easter has begun! We celebrate Christ's victory over death as we share in the life-giving meal of holy communion.

The Vigil begins in darkness and culminates in light. We move from a bare sanctuary to white and gold altar paraments. We raise the paschal candle as a symbol of Christ's victory over death with life eternal, remembering that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

Scammers have a new phishing trick for iPhone users – here's how to avoid falling victim

BYPASSING APPLE'S SAFETY MEASURES

- Scammers have a new trick up their sleeves, and are using it on iPhone users.
- They tell you to reply to their texts, which disables Apple's scam protection
- Thankfully, there are a few ways you can stay safe

Apple has built several scam-protection tools into iOS, one of which disables links in SMS messages if the text comes from an unknown number. However, it looks like scammers have found a way to bypass these defenses and send you dangerous links, despite Apple's best efforts.

As noted by *Bleeping Computer*, links are re-enabled if you reply to a message from an unknown source, as Apple assumes that replying means you trust the sender enough to also trust the URLs they've included.

However, scammers have latched onto this by instructing their victims to reply to their message, then click the re-enabled links. For instance, one scam message seen by *Bleeping Computer* contained a phishing link (which had been disabled), with the following text underneath it:

"LATEST VIDEOS FROM TECHRADAR - BEST CAMERA PHONE 2024

"Please reply Y, then exit the text message, reopen the text message activation link, or copy the link to Safari browser to open it."

The idea seems to be that people are so used to replying to automated texts with things like 'YES' and 'NO' that they will automatically do the same with the phishing messages, thereby enabling potentially dangerous links to work again.

HOW TO STAY SAFE

If you receive an unexpected message from an unknown source and see that the text contains links, do not reply to it. Doing so will make the links live again, but simply ignoring the text (and reporting it as spam) will ensure you can't fall victim to it.



If you aren't sure whether a message is genuine or not, the advice remains the same: do not reply to it. Instead, contact the company directly using its official channels. This will put you in touch with a legitimate employee who will be able to tell you whether the message you received is trustworthy or not.

Even if you don't click any suspicious links in the text, simply replying to the message will signal to the scammer that your number is active and that you are willing to engage with phishing messages, making you an inviting target.

It's better to be safe than sorry in these situations. If you've been sent a text you weren't expecting from a sender that claims to be an official source, it's best to be cautious rather than take any unnecessary risks. If in doubt, simply report it and don't interact with it.

We have public profiles on the internet and scammers impersonate clergy at an alarming rate of success. Please do not click or open anything suspicious. Always check the sender's email address. **Be safe and thank you!**


