It's that time of year when we inform you of the deadline that we would like you to bring in all of your tabs. Your tabs make up our huge wall of approximately 325 - 350 large white bags at our June wheelchair assembly. Please bring them in **no later than Friday, May 30th.** This way, there will be enough time for our helpers at Trailblazers to bag all that comes in and deliver them to our Access Storage unit.

FOLLOWING are the Tab Drop-Off locations:

Trailblazers Life Choices (Winnipeg) at 1069 Autumnwood Drive in Windsor Park.

They are located in a little strip mall directly behind Fire Paramedic Service No. 9 at the corner of Autumnwood Dr. and Cottonwood Rd. Trailblazers is open **Monday - Friday from 9:00** a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Please leave your tabs in the blue recycling box outside their front door. They are open year-round except for holidays.

Their place is also open **Monday - Friday** from **9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.** and open year-round except for holidays. This last year, they have taken on the extra responsibility of **also accepting cans**. Please take everything you bring to **Door #3** and if no one is there, just leave your tabs/cans outside the door.

If you have cans or metals of any kind (small or large) you can bring them to:

When you arrive, go to their office area and they will inform you what to do. Make sure you let them know that you want the value of what you brought in to be added to the Tabs for Wheelchairs' account. In the end, they will give you a receipt for what you brought in and our account will be credited. They in turn, give us a cheque for what has come in during the past year. They will take your tabs as well.
